STATE FAIR AWARDS & PREMIUMS

Prizes worth \$12,000.00 will be awarded. All first place winners will receive prizes. Grand and Reserve halter will receive buckles. High Point Open, High Point Amateur, 3-5 High Point Open, 3-5 High Point Amateur and High Point Youth prizes will be awarded. Ribbons will also be awarded.

Stalls will be available after 7:00 am on Thursday, August 23rd.

*Complete the stabling list for all owners and exhibitors who wish their animals to be stalled together.

*All exhibitors must work out of stalls, rather than out of trailers, due to the lack of available parking around the arenas.

PARKING

*Parking inside the fairgrounds requires a permit to enter. This permit must be requested on the entry form or may be purchased at the Equine Check-In Trailer and is for the sole use of the exhibitor. Parking permits are \$15.00 for exhibitors. All vehicles must have an exhibitor parking pass affixed to the driver's side of the front windshield. Parking passes are good for the entire run of the fair. All trucks and trailers will be required to park

in designated areas. Fair Management assumes no obligation or liability for any theft or damage that may occur to the vehicle or its contents.

REGISTRATION PAPERS

*No animal may be entered or exhibited as purebred unless the same has been recorded in the recognized books of record for the respective breed.

ENTRIES

*For 2018, the Nebraska State Fair will be accepting online entries **ONLY** for the Foundation Quarter Horse Show. Go to the state fair website, www.statefair.org, click on Get Involved, Horses, Premium Book. You will need to click on "CLICK HERE FOR ALL OTHER HORSE SHOW/EVENT "ONLINE" ENTRY" to enter the show. Late entries will be accepted until the barn is full. A late fee of \$50.00 per exhibitor will apply for all entries postmarked after July 31, 2018.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

*All horses being exhibited at the 2018 Nebraska State Fair must meet all of the equine health requirements, which are found at the following link: [2018 Equine and Equine Event Livestock Health Requirements](#).

REQUIRED CREDENTIALS

*The following documentation is required to show in the Nebraska State Fair Foundation Quarter Horse Show. These documents will be checked upon your arrival at the Nebraska State Fairgrounds.

1. A copy of the registration papers for each horse. All horses must be registered. Pending registrations will be accepted only on foals of the current year if breed association rules permit.
2. A copy of your FQHR membership – owners and riders.
3. A copy of your NEAFQHR membership – owners and riders.
4. A copy of your Amateur Certification, if applicable.
5. Current Health and Coggins papers as outlined in the premium book. Health papers and Coggins tests are required on all horses.

DOGS

Due to requirements of the liability insurance carrier and policy of all major livestock shows, NO dogs are allowed on the Nebraska State Fairgrounds, in parking lots or in buildings other than those for direct competition or service animals. All dogs must be on a leash. There shall be no loose or unattended dogs on the fairgrounds. No dogs will be permitted in the animal barns, in tie outs or on the Midway, except during authorized events and sanctioned dog shows. Dogs entered in Nebraska State Fair special performances or competitive events will be allowed on grounds or in buildings during performance or competition only.

FEED AND BEDDING

*All feed and bedding needs will be handled by Mid Nebraska Feeds, which is the local Purina dealer. Hay, bedding and/or feed will be available. You can pre-order feed and bedding by contacting them at 308-382-3048.

SHOW RULES

1. Classes will be governed by the rules of [Equine Information, Rules and Regulations](#), [General Livestock Information, Rules and Regulations](#), Foundation Quarter Horse Registry, and the Nebraska Affiliate Foundation Quarter Horse Registry. **By signing the entry form the exhibitor agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of The Nebraska State Fair. Exhibitor also agrees to abide by the International Association of Fairs and Exhibition National Code of Show Ring Ethics found in the Equine Rules and Regulations Handbook and also in the front of the premium book.**

2. Horse(s) must be entered in name of owner(s).
3. Youth exhibitor shall be 18 & under as of January 1 of the current year.
4. If size of class warrants, eliminations may be held at the discretion of the management.
5. Registration papers must reflect the current status of your horse. If your horse has been gelded, but you have not sent the papers in to reflect that, please do so immediately. Also, amateur and youth exhibitors can show horses belonging to themselves or an immediate family member. They may not show horses belonging to someone outside the family or in a ranch or corporation name, except in novice classes with a novice permit available at the show.
6. The 3-minute gate rule will be enforced. Plan accordingly.
7. All horses participating in the show, including herd holders and turn back horses must be FQHR registered and all participants, including herd holders and turn back riders and the owners of their horses must be members of FQHR and NEAFQHR.
8. An open signed blank check will be left at the show office at check-in to cover added classes and will be returned at check-out if no classes were added.
