General Awards

Grand Champion: \$10 & rosette ribbon to the best overall entry in each department.

1st place: \$5 & blue ribbon

2nd place: \$3 & red ribbon

3rd place: \$1 & white ribbon

First Time Exhibitor

This category was created to offer the opportunity of exhibiting without the nerves and intimidation that potential exhibitors may have. This information will be requested when exhibitors first register. A Top First Time Exhibitor will be chosen for each department.

Special Entry

We invite all community members to get involved so we hope this category can offer that opportunity without the nerves and intimidation that potential exhibitors may have. This category is for exhibitors with special needs or other circumstances, if you have questions about whether you are considered an exhibitor in this category, please contact the fair office. We won't request any information, but trust that exhibitors are mindful and honest when entering. This information will be requested when exhibitors first register. A Top Special Entry will be chosen for each department.

Premier Exhibitor Award

\$10 and a plaque will be awarded to the exhibitor accumulating the most points overall. \$5 and a certificate will be awarded to the exhibitor with the second most points. Points for ribbons are as follows: Purple: 6 points, Blue: 5 points, Red: 4 points, and White: 3 points. A Premier Exhibitor will be awarded for adult and youth. Edible Herbs – Themed Creative Presentation (Dept. 2, class 88)

This will be a special award category with the winner determined by votes received from fair attendees during fair days. Votes will be tallied and the winner will be announced at Noon on Sunday, August 25th. First place will receive \$10, second place \$6, and third \$4 along with rosette ribbons for each placing. This award is sponsored by **Kelly McSheehy**.

Green Thumb Gardener Award

\$10 and a plaque will be awarded to the exhibitor accumulating the most points in the following: Dept. 2- Fruits, Nuts, & Herbs; Dept. 4-Vegetables & Field Crops; and Dept. 5-Flowers. \$5 and a certificate will be awarded to the exhibitor with the second most points. Points for ribbons are as follows: Purple: 6 points, Blue: 5 points, Red: 4 points and White: 3 points. A Green Thumb Gardener will be awarded for adult and youth. This award is sponsored by **A Little of This & That**.

Best Cook Award

\$10 and a plaque will be awarded to the exhibitor accumulating the most points in Culinary Arts; \$5 and a certificate will be awarded to the exhibitor with the second most points. Points for ribbons are as follows: Purple: 6 points, Blue: 5 points, Red: 4 points and White: 3 points. A Best Cook will be awarded for adult and youth.

Special Contest

A special rosette ribbon will be awarded to the winner in this class determined by the judge.

Superintendent's Award

A special rosette ribbon will be awarded by the Superintendent to the entry that merits special recognition by the department superintendent. It does not need to be a placing entry.

Themed Contest

A special rosette ribbon will be awarded to the winner in this class determined by the judge. Emphasis is placed on entries with the best use of current fair theme.

Super 1 Foods Award

A \$10 **Super 1 Foods** gift certificate and special ribbon will be awarded to the best first place entry in the following classes: Dept. 2-Apples, Berries, Cherries, Grapes, Melons, Peaches, Pears, Plums, Tomatoes and Tomatillos/Ground Cherries; and Dept. 4-Beans, Beets, Cabbage, Carrots, Corn, Cucumbers, Eggplant, Garlic Bulbs & Allium, Kohlrabi, Onions, Peppers, Potatoes, Pumpkins & Gourds, Rhubarb, Summer Squash, and Winter Squash. The judges will select this award. In sections with only one entry, the award will be given at the judge's discretion. **Awards will be available for pickup during premium payouts.**



Idaho Wheat Commission-Cupcakes and Cake Pops

The Idaho Wheat Growers will award a mixer for the Best Cupcakes or Cake Pops chosen among all first-place winners for Classes 297 through 301 only. The "Best Cupcakes and Cake Pops" must be made with wheat flour, which includes all-purpose bleached or unbleached white, whole wheat, etc. Entries are to be entered on a disposable pie plate or glass plate. **The recipe for the winning entry will be requested for submittal to the Idaho Wheat Commission.**



Red Star Yeast Award

Red Star Yeast will award Red Star merchandise to 1st – 3rd in the adult division in all Yeast Bread Classes. To be eligible to win you must use Red Star Yeast in your bread. Also include a recipe card and attach the empty packet of Red Star Yeast used.



Wilton Award

Judges will select the "Best of Class" winners from Division 061 for Decorated Cakes, Classes 363-365 and Decorated Cupcakes, Class 369. **AWARDS WILL BE MAILED FROM WILTON AFTER FAIR. Professionals are not eligible for this award.**



Inland Northwest Machine Quilter's Award

Inland Northwest Machine Quilters guild of Spokane, Washington will be awarding one Best of Show Machine Quilting ribbon with a \$25 cash

award and one Honorable Mention ribbon to the Machine Quilters. Quilts of any size or style in the Adult Open Division that is machine quilted, either professionally or by the quilt maker are eligible for the award. **Prize money to be mailed after the fair concludes.**



North Idaho Quilter's Award

The North Idaho Quilters Guild will award 1st place receives NIQ ribbon and \$20 cash prize, 2nd receives NIQ ribbon to each of the following:

Adult- **Most Patriotic Quilt, Best use of hand embroidery or applique, Best use of machine embroidery or applique and Best Group Quilt.** Youth- **Best Overall Youth Quilt.** Winners will be determined based on work on construction, use of color and design, and application of hand or machine quilting. **Prize money to be mailed after the fair concludes.**
