General Rules for Crocheting

- Entries must be the work of the exhibitor, completed since September 2018.
- Limit one entry per class per exhibitor
- Must be 18 or older to enter.

Youth register in Department 18, but enter exhibits in Building 19.

- Where there is no competition, or entry has been incorrectly entered, judges may award first, second or third premiums or no premium, according to the merits of the entry. Judges shall not award premiums to any entry deemed unworthy; i.e., soiled or incomplete.
- Quality or brand of yarn will not be judged.

We invite all community members to get involved so we want to offer that opportunity without the nerves and intimidation that potential exhibitors may have.

When updating your personal information please make note if you could be considered an exhibitor in the special needs/other circumstances category. We will not request additional information, but trust that exhibitors are mindful and honest when entering. Exhibits will still be entered in classes listed with the limit of one entry per class; however, they will also be judged for top special entry.

WHAT THE JUDGES LOOK FOR WITH CROCHETING

- GENERAL APPEARANCE: Visual impact, presentation, clean, neat & well blocked
- SUITABILITY OF DESIGN, COLOR & YARN: Choice of yarn & trim type & color appropriate to pattern & function
- WORKMANSHIP: Stitches made correctly, uniform tension, correct gauge, no dropped stitches, blocked as needed, yarn ends joined & woven inconspicuously, construction details well executed, carried yarns neat and not too tight
- DIFFICULTY OF PROJECT

What the Judges look for in Tatting

- APPEARANCE & OVERALL EFFECT: Design selection & presentation, thread compatibility, use of color (if applicable)
- WORKMANSHIP & TECHNICAL SKILLS: Proper tension, neatness, finishing
- DIFFICULTY FACTOR

What the Judge looks for in Rugs

- GENERAL APPEARANCE: Neat & clean
- WORKMANSHIP: stitches correct, tension even, finishing techniques correct & neat
- SUITABILITY OF DESIGN, COLOR, THREAD: Choice of thread type and color appropriate to pattern & function, finishing techniques appropriate, choice of background fabric type & color appropriate to pattern & function
- DIFFICULTY OF PROJECT

- 87 Rugs, any article, specify item
- 88 Hooked or latch hooked item, any article, specify item



FROM OLD TO NEW



- This section illustrates what can be done with old or used material that might end up in the trash or otherwise discarded.
- Entry can be any item that is described in this department but cannot be entered in any other class.
- Entry must be prepared according to the General Instructions listed at the beginning of this department as well as any other instructions contained within.
- Entry must have an index card (measuring no larger than 4" x 6") securely attached that explains in 100 words or less the material's previous life. Explanation must be typed or legibly printed. Do NOT put your name on this card.
