General Rules for Hand Woven & Hand Spun Articles

- Entries must be the work of the exhibitor, completed since September 2018.
- Limit **one** entry per class per exhibitor
- **Must be 18 or older to enter.**
Youth register in Department 18, but enter exhibits in Building 19.
- The judges reserve the option to withhold ribbons and awards in a class where there is no deserving entry.

NEW

We invite all community members to get involved so we want to offer that opportunity without the nerves and intimidation that potential exhibitors may have.

When updating your personal information please make note if you could be considered an exhibitor in the special needs/other circumstances category. We will not request additional information, but trust that exhibitors are mindful and honest when entering. Exhibits will still be entered in classes listed with the limit of one entry per class; however, they will also be judged for top special entry.

What the Judges look for in Hand Spun Yarn

- **OVERALL GENERAL APPEARANCE**
- **PREPARATION FOR ENTRY:** Clean, properly skeined & tied with the same color yarn, listed yardage and/or weight noted, blocked if necessary
- **SUITABILITY OF FIBER TO YARN:** Amount of twist, diameter of yarn
- **TECHNIQUE:** Twist evenly executed, appropriate plying twist, diameter consistent throughout, structurally durable, designed yarns consistent, dyeing/blending consistent
- **SUITABILITY OF YARN TO USE:** Direction & amount of twist, diameter & handle of yarn, appropriate number of plies

HAND WOVEN & HAND SPUN ARTICLES

Division 10A

YARN

- Yarn entered to be 25-yard skeins at a minimum.
- Skeins must be securely tied with a figure-8 tie of the same yarn.
- Label skeined yarn according to fiber, how it was spun, and planned method (i.e., knit, crochet, weave) and use (i.e., type of article).

- 01 Wool singles yarn
- 02 Wool ply yarn
- 03 Blended fiber yarn
- 04 Angora rabbit yarn
- 05 Goat hair yarn (mohair, pygora, cashmere)
- 06 Silk yarn
- 07 Camelid fiber yarn (alpaca, llama, camel)
- 08 Bast fiber yarn (cotton, linen, hemp or other plant fibers)
- 09 Synthetic fibers (rayon, nylon, tencel)
- 10 Hand dyed wool yarn using natural dyes
- 11 Hand dyed wool yarn using chemical dyes
- 12 Hand dyed other than wool yarn, using natural dyes
- 13 Hand dyed other than wool yarn, using chemical dyes
- 14 Dog or cat yarn
- 15 Novelty wool yarn
- 16 Novelty yarn, using 2 or more fibers
- 17 Novelty yarn, using color as technique
- 18 Novelty yarn, using non-fiber elements such as beads, feathers, etc.
- 19 Yarn spun from commercial roving, single
- 20 Yarn spun from commercial roving, plied
- 21 Yarn spun from commercial roving, novelty
- 22 Yarn spun from fiber other than listed

GARMENTS & ACCESSORIES - MUST BE AT LEAST 50% HAND SPUN, OTHER 50% LABELED

- Include a yarn sample with your entry.
- Attach a 3x5 card with information on the use, technique and type of tool used to create the entry. Any information is valuable to the judge.

What the Judges look for in articles made of Handspun Yarn

- **OVERALL GENERAL APPEARANCE**
- **SUITABILITY OF YARN TO ARTICLE:** Consistency of spinning, appropriate yarn characteristics
- **SUITABILITY OF FIBER TO PRODUCT:** Fiber preparation, drapability, hand, durability
- **TECHNIQUE:** Gauge set, even tension, perfect execution, no uncorrected mistakes
- **FINISHING:** Blocking, ends, cleanliness, seams, appropriate notions

DECORATIVE & HOUSEHOLD ITEMS - MUST BE AT LEAST 50% HAND PROCESSED FIBER, OTHER 50% LABELED, ANY TECHNIQUE

- Include a yarn sample with your entry.
- Attach a 3x5 card with information on the use, technique and type of tool used to create the entry. Any information is valuable to the judge.

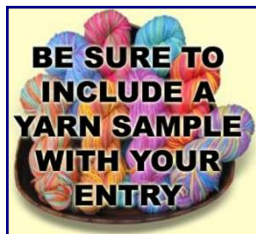

ARTICLE MADE FROM HAND MADE FELT

- Include a yarn sample with your entry.
- Attach a 3x5 card with information on the use, technique and type of tool used to create the entry. Any information is valuable to the judge.

- 46 Needle felted sculpture, small
- 47 Needle felted sculpture, medium

WEAVING WITH COMMERCIAL YARN - LABEL TYPE OF YARN USED

- Include a yarn sample with your entry.
- Attach a 3x5 card with information on the use, technique and type of tool used to create the entry. Any information is valuable to the judge.

What the Judges look for in Handwovens made from Commercial Yarns

- **OVERALL GENERAL APPEARANCE**
- **SUITABILITY OF FIBER & YARN TO ARTICLE:** Durability, drapability, compatibility of fibers, hand
- **TECHNIQUE:** Gauge set, even tension, perfect execution, no uncorrected mistakes
- **FINISHING:** Blocking, ends, cleanliness, seams, appropriate notions

- 54 Woven shawl, stole or pushmina
- 55 Woven accessory or household article, specify
- 56 Woven wall hanging
- 57 Woven yardage

- 58 Woven off loom

NOVICE WEAVING & SPINNING

Division 10B

NOVICE WEAVERS & SPINNERS

- “Novice” refers to anyone who is just starting out in weaving and spinning.
- Exhibitor can enter in this or any other section in this department.
- Anyone who has entered in prior Fairs in any other section is not considered a novice and should not enter in this section.
- Include a yarn sample with your entry.
- Attach a 3x5 card with information on the use, technique and type of tool used to create the entry. Any information is valuable to the judge.

CLASS

- 61 Yarn by novice weaver or spinner
- 62 Garment or accessory by novice weaver or spinner
- 63 Decorative or household item by novice weaver or spinner
- 64 Item woven with commercial yarn by novice weaver or spinner

WOOL SHOW

Division 10C

NORTH IDAHO WOOL SHOW

- Fleece must have been shorn this year and must not represent more than one year’s growth, except yearling fleeces. One fleece may be entered in each class and selected by exhibitor.
- Angora should be labeled as to breed and whether plucked or sheared. Angora should also include plucking or shearing of fiber, gathered during the last year, and be entered in a show box.
- Supply picture for display.
- Display small fleeces in a box or basket.

What the Judges look for with Fleece

- **OVERALL GENERAL APPEARANCE**
- **PREPARATION FOR ENTRY:** Debris, skirting, ties
- **FLEECE QUALITIES:** Cotting, discoloration, grease, moisture, soundness, sunburn
- **FIBER/BREED QUALITIES:** Staple length, uniformity, yield

- 68 Natural color fleece
