General Rules for Industrial Arts

- Entries must be the work of the exhibitor, completed since September 2018.
- Must be 18 to enter. Youth register in Department 18, but enter exhibits in Building 17.
- Limit one entries per class per exhibitor
- Youth entries from department 18 drop entries off in building 17 for judging.

We invite all community members to get involved so we want to offer that opportunity without the nerves and intimidation that potential exhibitors may have. When updating your personal information please make note if you could be considered an exhibitor in the special needs/other circumstances category, or are a first time exhibitor. We won't request any information, but trust that exhibitors are mindful and honest when entering. Exhibits will still be entered in classes listed with the limit of one entry per class; however, they will also be judged for top special entry and top first time entry.

WOOD PROJECTS Division 14A

 Woodworking entries cannot be built with purchased precut pieces and ready-to-assemble kits. However, some features may be prefabricated, such as turned pegs or wheels for toys. Movable parts must be securely attached to the base.

What the Judges look for in Woodworking

- APPEARANCE & ARTISTRY
- **CRAFTSMANSHIP:** Skillfulness, neatness, finishing
- DEGREE OF DIFFICULTY: Scale & complexity of the piece
- **DESIGN:** How well the piece addresses issues of form, function, materials & engineering

WOOD CARVING

What the Judges look for in Wood Carving

- ORIGINALITY & CREATIVITY: Own idea, uniqueness, realistic carving proportions correct
- WORKMANSHIP & EXECUTION: Cut clean, degree of difficulty, intricacy, no glue showing
- FINISH: Complete, colors complementary, shading & contrast, high contrast on stylized pieces
- ARTISTIC APPEAL: Pleasing to the eye, habitat (birds, fish, etc.) compatible & natural

LEATHER PROJECTS

Division 14B

- Leatherworking entries cannot be constructed with purchased ready-to-assemble kits.
- ALL ENTRIES SEWN USING THREAD AND A SEWING MACHINE OR BY HAND MUST BE ENTERED IN DEPARTMENT 7 - SEWING. ITEMS NOT SEWN, INCLUDING CLOTHING ITEMS CONSTRUCTED WITH LEATHER STRIPS, ARE TO BE ENTERED IN THIS DEPARTMENT.

What the Judges look for in Leather Projects

- GENERAL APPEARANCE: Clean & ready for exhibit, good condition, pattern & decoration well placed, fits shape of article
- WORKMANSHIP: Edges smooth, even & well finished; lacing evenly spaced, neat & secure; fasteners & closures appropriate & secure; decoration & pattern clear, definite & neat; tooling & carving sharp; finish & stain smooth & even.
- SUITABILITY: Material suitable for article; sturdy for intended use
- DIFFICULTY OF PROJECT

What the Judges look for in Metal Projects

- **ORIGINALITY & CREATIVITY**: Own idea, uniqueness
- WORKMANSHIP & EXECUTION: Edges turned properly with no sharpness, welding, riveting and connections properly done, degree of difficulty, intricacy
- FINISH: Clean & polished, no finger marks
- **ARTISTIC APPEAL**: Pleasing to the eye

- Entry must be entirely the work of the exhibitor, completed since September 2018.
- Submit photographs of the entry before and during restoration.
- Provide an explanation of the techniques used. Commercially-acquired techniques and/or applications not permitted.
- Entry will be judged on overall appearance and techniques used.

- This section illustrates what can be done with old or used material that might end up in the trash or otherwise discarded.
- Entry can be any item that is described in this department but cannot be entered in any other class.
- Entry must be prepared according to the General Instructions listed at the beginning of this department as well as any other instructions contained within.
- Entry must have an index card (measuring no larger than 4" x 6") securely attached that explains in 100 words or less the material's previous life. Explanation must be typed or legibly printed. Do NOT put your name on this card.
