**DIVISION 8- GOAT CONTEST CLASSES**

**Placing:** 1 through 6, Ribbons .

**Learning Objective:** To demonstrate skills involving costume coordination, show preparation, and milking techniques learned.

**Judging:** All Goat Contest Classes will be judged on Thursday, July 16<sup>th</sup> starting at 9:00 am.

**Rules for milking class:** Contestants will milk for the time of one (1) minute. Each exhibitor will milk his or her own goat. Milk will be weighed and placing will be determined by pounds milked. Milking class will be Thursday, July 16<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM.

**080801** Milking Class Senior (ages 15– 9)

**080802** Milking Class Intermediate (ages 12–14)

**080803** Milking Class Junior (ages 8–11)

**Rules for Costume Class:** A goat exhibitor may show one entry in this class. Both the goat and exhibitor must be in costume to compete. Costumes must be safe for the animal, exhibitor and spectators and must not cause discomfort to the animal.

**Rules for Obstacle Class:** To be posted day of class. Obstacle class will show Thursday, July 16<sup>th</sup> after the costume class. Exhibitors registering for the goat obstacle course MUST show their project animal. Competition animals may only be shown by one exhibitor. An open obstacle course will be held following the competition for any exhibitor interest in trying for fun.

**Rules:**

1. Exhibitors must read and follow General Rules and Livestock Department Rules.
2. Exhibitor must follow all MDARD Animal Health Requirements as posted on Fair web site: [www.oakfair.org](http://www.oakfair.org). Call the Fair Office to obtain a copy of these requirements or go to [www.michigan.gov/mda-exhibitorinfo](http://www.michigan.gov/mda-exhibitorinfo).
3. All market hog exhibitors must be PQA or YCQA certified and must present a copy of certification before unloading animal(s).
4. All ear tags must be clean and readable before the animal is unloaded.

5. Market hogs must be under ownership by Discovery Day of the current year.
6. For Homegrown classes, a second animal entered by an exhibitor cannot place until all exhibitors first animal has been placed.
7. Weight classes will be determined after all animals are weighed in. All hogs weighing over 220 lbs. will be divided into three divisions.
8. Class winners will compete for division Champion and Reserve Champion. Division Champions and Reserve Champions will then compete for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Market Hog.
9. Five to Seven year old competitive exhibitors are not eligible to enter classes in Department 10.
