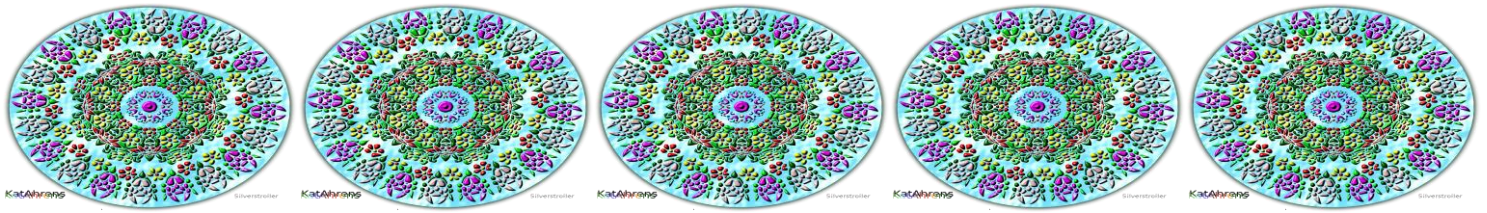
The Glittered Prairie

Tex-Mex Chicken Salad

Ingredients:

- **1 ¼ lb. baked/grilled chicken (chopped)**
- **1 small red pepper (chopped)**
- **1 small red onion (chopped)**
- **14 oz yellow corn (drained and rinsed)**
- **1 can black beans (drained and rinsed)**
- **1 bunch of cilantro (roughly chopped)**
- **½ cup mayonnaise**
- **¼ cup sour cream**
- **½ tsp ground cumin**
- **¼ tsp chili powder or Jerry**

Directions:

Combine the mayonnaise, sour cream and chili powder and stir well. Pour over remaining ingredients and stir. Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours. It's better to leave overnight.
