ENTRY DEADLINE: JUNE 15

BEEF

1. Exhibitors entering open classes in this division should familiarize themselves with the General Rules and Regulations and Livestock Entry Rules of the Ozark Empire Fair before completing entry forms.
2. Exhibitors entering junior classes should familiarize themselves with Junior Show Rules, General Rules and Livestock Entry Rules before completing entry.
3. Junior shows are open to all youth who are 8 years of age as of July 1, but not over 22 years of age as of July 1. Entries from in-state and out-of-state exhibitors will be accepted in the junior shows of all OEF breeding beef divisions with the exception of the Supreme Beef Heifer Show. To be eligible for the Supreme Beef Heifer Show, the exhibitor's primary residence must be in one of the following counties: Barry, Barton, Bates, Benton, Camden, Cedar, Christian, Dade, Dallas, Douglas, Greene, Henry, Hickory, Howell, Jasper, Laclède, Lawrence, McDonald, Miller, Morgan, Newton, Ozark, Polk, Pulaski, St. Clair, Stone, Taney, Texas, Vernon, Webster and Wright. Entries outside of the counties listed above will be accepted for the junior show and are eligible to compete for grand and reserve grand champion, but they will not be eligible to compete for the Supreme Heifer Awards. Should entries from outside of the counties listed be selected as grand champion and/or reserve grand champion in a breed, a grand and/or reserve grand champion will be selected from the southwest region that represents the counties listed as eligible to represent such breed in the Supreme Heifer Drive.
4. ****NEW 2018** A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Bred & Owned Female will be selected during the Supreme Heifer Drive. Grand Champion Bred & Owned Female will receive \$1,500, Reserve Grand Champion Bred & Owned Female will receive \$750. Females can compete in both the Supreme Drive and Bred & Owned Champion Drive.**
5. **There is no cap on the number of breeding beef divisions a junior exhibitor may show in or how many entries they can qualify to compete in the Supreme Drive or Bred & Owned Championship Drive. However, an exhibitor will only be eligible for one premium in the Supreme Drive or Bred & Owned Championship Drive. Heifers will be picked until five different exhibitors in the Supreme Drive and 2 different exhibitors in the Bred & Owned Championship have been selected to pay premiums. For example, an exhibitor could win Supreme, Third and Fifth but will only be paid for Supreme and additional six, seven, eight or more heifers may have to be selected to find the five exhibitors to pay.**
6. **In order for a beef division to be eligible for the Supreme Drive and Bred & Owned Awards, a \$500 contribution will be required of each breed. This payment is due in the OEF Livestock office on or prior to June 15. The \$500 will be distributed as follows: \$250 will be awarded to the breed grand champion and \$250 will be awarded to the breed's bred and owned grand champion. Breed grand champions & Bred and Owned Grand Champions must be shown in the Supreme Drive and/or Champion Bred & Owned Drive in order to receive the \$250 award. Otherwise the award will be presented to the reserve breed champion. Should a breed's grand champion be selected as a top five female and/or Grand or Reserve Grand Champion Bred & Owned, \$250 will NOT be awarded on top of the supreme winnings. Any exhibitor who resides in the state of Missouri will be eligible for the bred and owned award in each breed, but will not be eligible for the Supreme Drive unless primary residence is in one of the counties listed in #3 above. A breed may elect to contribute \$250 to the bred & owned grand champion and not the \$250 for the breed grand champion and vice versa. However, breeds who elect not to contribute funds to the breed grand champion and/or bred and owned champion will not be permitted to compete in the Supreme Drive and/or Bred & Owned Champion Drive. In addition, the \$250 bred & owned award will not be presented unless sponsored. Checks should be made payable to the Ozark Empire Fair Foundation.**
7. Entry forms are available at www.ozarkempirefair.com or at the Ozark Empire Fair Office. Entry forms may be copied. Enter Online at www.ozarkempirefair.com.
8. Each animal must have correct registration papers, health papers, tattoos and/or identifying marks recognized by respective breed associations. These will be checked against the information given on the entry form.
9. **All cattle will be bedded with material provided by the Ozark Empire Fair. NO OTHER BEDDING MATERIAL MAY BE USED. Exhibitors are responsible for their own tie-out bedding.**
10. **SEE SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS IN LIVESTOCK ENTRY RULES.**
11. Entries close **June 15** and those mailed must be postmarked no later than midnight of this date. Late entries may be accepted through June 25. Entries post-marked after midnight June 15 and through midnight June 25 must be accompanied by the penalty fee of \$25.00 per head in addition to regular fees.
12. Stalls and location in the barns will be designated only by the division superintendent. **Cow/Calf entries must purchase two (2) stalls.**
13. Animals shall be brought to the barns by 9 a.m. each day and remain in the barns, except when showing, until tie-out time at 7 p.m. Tie-out space (three feet) per head is provided. No tie-outs permitted in the trailer area.
14. **GROOMING CHUTES:** Exhibitors may pay a \$20 charge for a grooming chute space with their stall assignments, if room permits. **Please indicate on entry blank if you are paying for a grooming chute space.** Exhibitors who do not choose to pay for a chute space will be allowed to have a grooming chute in the barn or proximity of the barn on show day only. Chutes are to be used only in assigned stalling and make-up areas. Any chutes outside this area are subject to removal and exhibitor will be fined \$25.

Junior Entries: Use same division numbers as open shows. Use class numbers listed in the left-hand column of each section. **Junior animals are NOT automatically entered in open shows.** Each animal must be entered into the respective junior and open classes. No refund of entry will be made for junior exhibitors who wish to not participate in the open show.

JUNIOR BEEF SHOWMANSHIP

Two classes will be offered in each breed based on age of youth as of July 1, 2018. Juniors are 13 years and younger; seniors are 14 years and older.

1. No pre-entry is required. No entry fee is required.
2. All participants shall have entered and exhibited in the 2018 Ozark Empire Fair junior beef cattle show. Showmanship participation must be in the breed the exhibitor showed in regular classes.
3. There must be at least two participants in each showmanship class of each breed or classes will be combined and only one award given.
4. There must be at least two participants in each breed or classes will be dropped and no award given.

Earl K. Nau Scholarship

-An endowment fund in memory of Earl K. Nau has been established at the Ozark Empire Fair to provide an annual scholarship to a junior beef cattle exhibitor at the Fair. The Nau Family provides the funding of the scholarship to honor their late father.

-Applicants must be at least 15 years of age and have exhibited breeding beef cattle at the Ozark Empire Fair for at least two years. Applicants will achieve scores based on winnings in:

- * Junior beef classes
- * Showmanship classes
- * Open beef classes
- * Herdsmanship awards
- * Other 4-H/FFA exhibit classes

-Applicants will also receive points for participation (and ranking) in district 4-H/FFA livestock judging competition, as well as, for service at the Fair as a volunteer in either the 4-H or FFA Exhibit Buildings or activities. The period of participation to be evaluated is from the 2017 Ozark Empire Fair through July 16, 2018.

-The scholarship winner will receive \$1,500 for tuition, textbooks or other fees associated with the pursuit of a post-secondary education. **Applications must be received (mailed or delivered) in the Fair Office no later than 4 p.m., July 16.** Applications are available at www.ozarkempirefair.com.

-The scholarship will be presented at the Angus Show on Saturday, July 28.

JUNIOR SUPREME CHAMPION FEMALE | 3:30 p.m. Saturday, August 4 - Arena

The **OZARK EMPIRE FAIR FOUNDATION** will award \$2,500 to the Junior Supreme Champion Female and \$1,500 to the Junior Reserve Supreme Champion Female. In addition, third, fourth and fifth place exhibitors will also be selected and awarded \$1,000; \$750 and \$500, respectively. If the junior exhibitor cannot be present to show their animal, another Ozark Empire Fair junior exhibitor in good standing may show in their place. The exhibitor must notify management and submit their replacement showman for approval by the end of the day the animal qualifies for the Supreme Drive. The exhibitor must have shown their animal in the breeding beef division show to qualify for Supreme. **Fitting Rule:** See Section L (Show Ring Code of Ethics and Conduct) under Livestock Rules found in Administration and General Rules. **Exhibitor Dress:** Western attire consisting of nice jeans and a collard shirt. Only western boots or dark leather shoes allowed. No hats or caps.

Junior Beef Awards Program

A Junior Beef Awards program will also be held at this time. **Herd Builder Voucher: 2018 Junior Beef Breeding Exhibitors who's primary residence is in one of the following counties:** Barry, Barton, Bates, Benton, Camden, Cedar, Christian, Dade, Dallas, Douglas, Greene, Henry, Hickory, Howell, Jasper, Laclède, Lawrence, McDonald, Miller, Morgan, Newton, Ozark, Polk, Pulaski, St. Clair, Stone, Taney, Texas, Vernon, Webster and Wright will be eligible to win a \$1,000 Herd Builder Voucher. **Anyone who has been awarded a voucher in previous years are not eligible.** Vouchers will be good toward the purchase of a female, either privately or at auction from any sponsoring breeder. The number of vouchers awarded will depend upon the number of \$150 sponsorships provided by breeders. **Junior exhibitors must be present at the Supreme Drive/Awards Program to win.** Vouchers are valid for 1 year.

No arrival prior to noon Tuesday, July 31.**RELEASE:** 7 p.m., Saturday, August 4.**Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open and Junior Shows**

1. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered meeting the requirements for registration as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis Rules and Regulations for Registration, and shall be governed by the last revised version of the **Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open & Junior Shows.**
2. Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. This means the active or junior member has paid all current dues and fees with no outstanding balances on their account.
3. **All** animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspection at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and one (1) from the Breed Standards Committee.
4. Heifers 24 months of age or older must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician.
5. A cow shown with calf at side: Calf must be her natural calf meeting the Standard of Excellence. Calf must be registered if older than thirty (30) days. If calf is less than 30 days of age it is subject to registration.
6. All senior bull classes (late junior yearling bull and over) must have either a nose ring or a nose clip for show purposes.
7. All animals must be individually identified by tattoo and/or numerical fire or freeze brand.
8. To be eligible to compete in SGBI approved junior shows, animal(s) must be recorded in the name of the junior member. This recorded junior must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered. *Ownership deadline is April 7 for all animals born May 1 and thereafter and November 1 for all other animals.*
9. All animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. ***Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show.** *Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick; head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clip using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped (no steer or Brahman clips) and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tailhead clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.); trim tail (no shear except back side). Fitting handbook should be studied.*
10. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
11. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
12. Polled classes *will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show.* Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge.
13. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals must be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence or horny tissue.
14. There must be at least five (5) exhibitors and twenty-five (25) head of cattle, or minimum of fifty (50) head of cattle, to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis Show.
15. In all shows in which fifty (50) head or less are entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of the show officials.
16. Classes with over thirty (30) entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
17. The judge **must** be an SGBI approved judge.
18. Dress for exhibitors participating in SGBI sanctioned Open and Junior shows shall be of neat and clean clothing of colored shirts with sleeves, belts, no midribs showing and appropriate footwear—no tennis shoes. Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded -- no caps.
19. Juniors showing in open shows is allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents, legal guardian). No animal may be fitted or shown by any open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. An exception is transportation feed and care to a show may be allowed. *Refer to junior ownership rules.*
20. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure **without** alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, pharmaceutical or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid, diuretic or any other substance is allowed. **ALL** animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.

21. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.
22. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his/her entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him/her to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.
23. Any person who furnished the birthday of an animal to SGBI either on the IPRA or some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in an SGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the SGBI designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than thirty (30) days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certificate shall be barred from showing in an SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one (1) year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However, the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be show again.
24. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgments, either past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision there from.
25. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association.
26. **APPEALS:** Procedures available in show office upon request.
27. **PROCEDURES TO FILE PROTEST:** Procedures available in show office upon request.
28. Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show's rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules, and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.
29. **DISQUALIFICATIONS:** An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge over-looked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge (s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show officials may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude them from further competition; exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him/her may be moved up (at the option of the Shows and Exhibits Committee) to fill the vacated position.
30. **RULES FOR HIGH POINT AWARDS:** For each point show, first place class winner will receive 2 points; second place class winner receives 1 point; Division Champion receives 3 points; Reserve Division Champion receives 2 points; Grand Champion receives 5 points and Reserve Grand Champion receives 4 points; Best of Polled receives 1 point but does not count toward overall points. Get of Sire and Produce of Dam points go toward Exhibitor/Breeder of the Year Awards. Points will stay with animal if sold. The Sire and Dam of the Year should have points from at least two (2) different offspring. All points earned at the National Open Show are to be doubled.
31. **CONDUCT IN THE SHOW RING:** If any exhibitor/owner/showman interferes in any way with the judge or shows disrespect to him, or to the show in the ring, the exhibitor/owner/showman may be dismissed by the judge or show management from the ring. The management may withhold from each exhibitor/owner/showman any premium monies that may have been awarded or take other steps deemed desirable.
32. **DNA TEST ON QUESTIONABLE ANIMALS:** Santa Gertrudis Breeders International and its representatives reserve the right to require any test deemed necessary to verify the accuracy of an entry, classification and/or the pedigree of exhibited Santa Gertrudis animals, including calves exhibited at the side of a Santa Gertrudis female.
