

# PERMANENT AND TEMPORARY EXHIBITIONS

**PPHM** offers student tours that provide opportunities to make personal connections to the Panhandle, to Texas and beyond, reinforcing subjects taught in the classroom. Tours can be customized to a teacher's specifications, content and duration during the scheduling process. This visit can feature docent-guided tours or teacher-guided tours. Each portion of a guided tour lasts about 20–30 minutes. Large groups of students will be divided into smaller groups of 20–30 students. Each group should have a teacher or a chaperone in charge. Groups can choose up to three programs, activities and/or tours for their visit.

**PALEONTOLOGY**—Encounter the skeletal remains of animals that lived in the prehistoric Panhandle.

**PIONEER TOWN**—Pioneer Town creates a dynamic, immersive learning environment including sights and sounds and many fully accessible structures with hands-on activities.

**THE PANHANDLE PETROLEUM STORY**—Travel through the beginnings of the oil boom and beyond in our brand-new, interactive gallery.

**PEOPLE OF THE PLAINS**—Discover how people have lived and survived on the Plains for 12,000 years.

**ART**—See the best collection of historic Texas art as well as our new Eastern American and European gallery. (Self Guided)

**TRANSPORTATION**—From a big-wheeled bike from the late 19th century to the automobiles of the 1960s, this exhibit is always a favorite. (Self Guided)

**POP CULTURE**—Travel back in time from the 1950s to the 2000s and see how technology, clothing, movies and historical events shaped the world of pop culture. (Self Guided)


