Acclaimed Musicians Perform Piano Quartets by Mozart and Strauss at The Chapel Restoration on May 27

Cold Spring, N.Y., May, 2018— Violinist David Chan, violist Mark Holloway, cellist Julia Bruskin, and pianist Aaron Wunsch will perform the Mozart Piano Quartet in G Minor and the Piano Quartet in C Minor by Richard Strauss at the 4:00 pm concert at the historic Chapel on the Hudson. The concert is free to the public. Donations are suggested.

David Chan is the concertmaster of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra and an active conductor, soloist, recitalist, and chamber musician. He made his New York debut at Lincoln Center's Avery Fisher Hall in 1995, his Carnegie Hall debut in 2003, and has recently appeared as soloist at Carnegie Hall with the Met Orchestra in a performance of Gubaidulina's "In Tempus Praesens" conducted by Fabio Luisi. Mr. Chan is currently on the faculty at The Juilliard School. **Violist Mark Holloway** is a chamber musician sought after in the United States and abroad. He has appeared at numerous festivals, has performed in far-flung locales from Chile to Greenland, and plays regularly in Europe. He has performed as a guest with the New York Philharmonic, Orpheus, and the Metropolitan Opera, and been principal violist at Tanglewood and of the New York String Orchestra. **Julia Bruskin** is considered one of the premiere cellists of her generation. She has performed Samuel Barber's Cello Concerto at Avery Fisher Hall, appeared as soloist with the Nashville Symphony, Utah Symphony, Virginia Symphony, and Pacific Symphony among others and is a frequent guest at summer music festivals. A founding member of the critically acclaimed Claremont Trio, Ms. Bruskin tours extensively with the trio, and also plays with the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra and appears in frequent solo recitals with her husband, Aaron Wunsch. **Pianist Aaron Wunsch** enjoys a multifaceted career as a performer, presenter, and educator. He has performed on concert stages throughout the US, Europe and Asia, and has worked closely with many renowned composers,

including Thomas Adès, Nico Muhly, and Kaija Saariaho. Mr. Wunsch is currently a full-time faculty member at The Juilliard School, Artistic Director of the acclaimed Music Mondays concert series in New York City, and Co-Artistic Director of the Skaneateles Festival.

The Chapel Restoration, 45 Market Street in Cold Spring, is across from Metro-North Station, where free parking is available on weekends.
