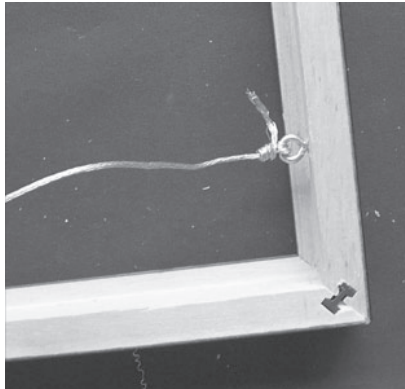

Youth Fine Arts Guidelines

- ◆ Entry fees: \$1.00 per entry.
- ◆ Exhibitor must be under the age of 18 as of December 31, 2018.
- ◆ Please put **Exhibitor's Name, Age, Phone Number, School, Grade, Division & Class on a 3 X 5 card** taped to the back of your entry in the top right corner, (put the card on the bottom of all sculptures).
- ◆ **Theme:** If you would like to have your entry considered for the "Fair Theme" ribbon, you **must** write the word "Theme" on your entry form and on the label on the back of your artwork. Art work must depict the fair theme "Party like an Animal!"
- ◆ Art exhibits limited per artist as follows:
 - 5 entries of framed art
 - 5 entries of paper backed with construction paper, mat board or cardboard ready to be hung
 - 5 sculpture entries
- ◆ Entries **must not** have been entered in **any previous** San Bernardino County Fairs.
- ◆ Any piece of Art that depicts any Racial, Bloody, or Gang Related material will not be permitted.
- ◆ **School/Group Projects:** See Divisions 549-556 to enter your School/Group Projects.
- ◆ If you have questions concerning your entry, please contact the Youth Fine Arts Department Chairperson or Co-Chairperson. The Chairperson and/or Fair Management reserve the right to refuse any picture that is not suitable for display. All general information, local and state rules apply to the entire Youth Fine Arts Department.

Display – Framing

- ◆ **All art must be ready to hang. Art will be turned away and Exhibitor will be given another drop off day if art is not ready to be hung.** The wire on the back of framed paintings must be taut with no wire showing above the frame. See picture for example for proper hanging.
- ◆ **No stand picture frames or clips will be allowed.**
- ◆ All framed paper (not canvas) paintings (watercolor, crayon, graphite, colored pencil, mixed media or acrylic on paper) should have acrylic plastic (Plexiglas) covering the painting. **Glass will be allowed only on pastel & charcoal paintings.**
- ◆ No wet paint.
- ◆ Size limit: Entries shall not exceed 40" (including the frame) in any direction.
- ◆ Original works only. No pre-printed pages (i.e. coloring book pages), except class projects.



Awards

- ◆ All entries, preschool through 12 years old, will receive either a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place ribbon.
- ◆ For all exhibitors age 13 through 17, there will be one 1st place, one 2nd place and one 3rd place ribbon awarded per class. All other entries will receive a participation ribbon only.
- ◆ There will be a Best of Division ribbon for each division.
- ◆ There will be a People's Choice Ribbon awarded. This winner will be selected by the public's votes during the Fair.
- ◆ No premiums are offered in our Youth Department. All cash and prizes awarded are donated by our generous Sponsors.
