1. **Divisions in this Department are restricted to FFA Chapters & 4-H Clubs of San Bernardino County.**
2. Set-up dates & times:
 - May 19, 11am to 7pm
 - May 20, 11am to 7pm
 - May 21, 9am to 7 pm
3. All exhibits must be in place by 7:00 pm May 21, 2020
4. Each landscape design exhibit must be complete in itself. Exhibitors must furnish their own superstructures and accessories.
5. All exhibits must be properly labeled (Scientific and common names) for educational value. Labeling is to be on a stand and shall be securely anchored. No identification of exhibitor and club or chapter will be allowed on exhibit prior to judging.
6. Exhibits must be built to last for the duration of the fair to be eligible for premiums and awards. Exhibits must be kept in fresh condition and each club or chapter is responsible for the care & maintenance of their exhibits. General watering & maintenance will be provided. Any and all special care required shall be the responsibility of the exhibitors.
7. Parents, advisor and other adults shall ADVISE ONLY and shall not participate in construction of any exhibit. A responsible adult for each chapter or club must be present at all times during the installation and set up of the exhibits. Exhibitors found in violation will forfeit cash awards & entry fee.
8. No chain saws, electric shovels or rototillers will be permitted.
9. *****NEW** There are a limited number of plots available. Therefor the landscapes will be limited to one per club or chapter and then on a first entered first placed basis if a club has entered more then one. Plots will be assigned by livestock office.***

Special Rules

1. Size: Exhibit spaces will be 8' X 8" space..
2. All spaces will be outside, randomly placed throughout the show grounds.
3. No sales allowed. However, exhibitors may promote and/or advertise their services, interests and/or products.
4. There will be a limited amount of space with electricity available. Cords used to distribute power to electrical apparatus shall be rated 15 AMPS minimum and contain ground wire. Cords not meeting these requirements will not be permitted.

Local Rules

1. Entry Fee: \$2.00 per entry
2. Items to be received: May 22, 2020 from 10:00am to 7:00 p.m.
3. Exhibits removed May 31, 2020 8:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
4. Exhibitors entering exhibits must be regularly enrolled in a high school that is following the California State Plan for Agriculture Education or a 4-H member in good standings enrolled in a mechanical science, Stem or welding project.
5. Exhibits need not be owned by exhibitor. However, all entries must be the products of student's work as a regular part of their instruction in Agricultural Mechanics for the past year.
6. No entry may be shown for more than one calendar year. All items entered **MUST BE** clean and ready for display. The exhibit superintendent may reject items not meeting this requirement.
7. Exhibitors may not enter more than one article from the same pattern.
8. Exhibitors limited to three entries per class, each item must be entered separately.

Most Innovative / Original Exhibit: Originality and workmanship will be taken into consideration. The judge will select the exhibit to be awarded.

Outstanding Exhibit: Size and workmanship will be taken into consideration. The judge will select this outstanding exhibit.

Please indicate if you would like your project to be sold in the silent auction by entering it in the Make the sale division.

Silent auction will start May 23, 2020 and will end 30 minutes after the Jr. Livestock Auction on May 30, 2020.

Best of Division winners only may sell during the Jr. Livestock Auction.

All items must be picked up on May 31, 2020 8:00 pm to 9:00 pm.

The item awarded the **"Make the Sale"** division winner is not eligible for the silent auction. However, it will sell during the Jr. Livestock Auction.

Division 1605—"Make the Sale"

Class 1 All Entries

1. Items may be separated into different classes at the discretion of management and the judge.
2. Limit 1 entry per exhibitor.
3. Entry selected for Best of Show in this division will sell in the Jr. Livestock Auction. Sale will be paid out in the form of a check mailed to the exhibitor after item has been paid for and payment has been cleared, less a 5% contingency fee.
4. Entry may be double entered in another division.
5. No premiums paid
6. Winning item is not eligible for the silent auction

Recycled Yard Art

The purpose of the Recycled Yard Art Contest is to increase environmental awareness and encourage reuse/recycling of materials into yard art as well as to add some character to the livestock department. The competition involves two and three dimensional art created from items already used for their original purpose.

ENTRY CRITERIA:

1. Designs are to include one or all of the three R's: reduce, reuse and recycle.
2. Art should be positive in content and expression and must be able to withstand outdoor elements.
3. Two- or three-dimensional art and kinetic sculptures will be accepted.
4. All work must be ready for installation including hanger wires, display bases and/or mounts as required for each piece. Entries must be easily moved by one person (weigh no more than 40 pounds or can be easily moved because it is on rollers/wheels).
5. Entries must be created mostly with recycled or recyclable materials. Exceptions include glue, writing and coloring materials.
6. The judging committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria or presents a health or safety hazard.
