Clean Barn Award

Clean Barn Rules & Guidelines:

1. The Livestock Superintendent will make inspections at unannounced times each day by a committee appointed.
2. All Clubs/Chapters must have a sign clearly visible for the duration of the Fair. If the group's sign is displayed that is an automatic entry for the contest. If signs are not displayed, the Club/Chapter will not be considered for any awards.

Judging Guidelines and Score Sheet

Cleanliness of Alley, Pens and Animals:	75 pts
Are the Alleyways free of straw, litter and hazardous equipment:	20 pts
Are the pens clean and fresh appearing:	20 pts
Are the animals free of soil, watered, appear fed and well kept:	20 pts
Does the youth show respect for the public and fellow exhibitors:	5 pts
Is the display creatively and attractively arranged? Does it show member planning and involvement:	15 pts
Does club/chapter have member on duty to clean area & answer Questions:	15 pts
Are all cattle double tied or all pens securely latched:	5 pts
Total:	100 Pts

Livestock Educational Display Contest

This contest is a separate contest from the Clean Barn Contest. The purpose of these displays is to educate the public about the various aspects of livestock production. Displays will be poster board size. Poster board or tri-fold display not to be more than 36" x 48". Livestock office staff will hang poster. All posters are to be in the livestock office by May 21, 2020 by 7:00pm.

Livestock Educational Display Rules & Guidelines:

The Livestock Educational Display will be judged at random with emphasis on the following items:

1. Use of Fair Theme, Use of signage, illustrations; Presentation Methods; and the Ease of understanding by the Public.
2. Clubs, Chapters or individuals may enter. Name and club or chapter must be on back of display.
3. Must include subject in enter.

Livestock Olympics

Each 4-H Club, Grange or FFA Chapter will be allowed to enter one team consisting of a boy and a girl. Special allowances will be made for organizations that do not have both.

Entrants shall be present at the arena area. When the chicken portion of the program begins, there will be an elimination contest known as the "**Crow, Cackle and Gobble Contest**". Style as well as the imitation of the sound will be judged. Through this contest the number of teams will be reduced to ten (10) to compete in the Chicken Olympic Decathlon.

There are three events in the Decathlon and the winning team of each event will be given 10 points, the second 9 points, the third 8 points, etc.

Entry Fee:\$10.00

1. Display shall be Agriculture based and aimed toward education and marketing to the general public.
2. Display shall fit inside a 6' x 6' pen. Must stay inside dimensions.
3. All materials must be flame retardant.
4. Exhibitor, clubs and chapters are required to maintain display throughout the duration of the fair.
5. Exhibitor, club or chapter must provide all needed materials.
6. All Displays must be finished by May 21, 2020, 9 pm

Adult Showmanship Guidelines:

1. Open to Adults wanting the chance to show members how it's done!!!! Be creative and "show" us what you've got!! Have your own theme or work on one as a club or chapter project. Adults must beg, borrow or steal their showmanship animal and any equipment needed. Minimum knowledge needed. Good sense of humor and the need for fun required!!
2. Closed-toed shoes must be worn.
3. **Entry fee is \$10.00. If someone has entered you and you would like to get out of it, then you may pay \$20.00 to get out of showing.** All money to benefit the junior livestock awards program.
4. **All bribes to the judges are graciously accepted & encouraged.** All monies will go towards the awards program.
5. Entries will be judged by the Senior 4-H and Advanced FFA showmanship winners.

Cotton & Cream Fashion Show

Cotton & Cream Fashion Show Guidelines:

1. Entry Fee: \$3.00
2. The object of this class is two-fold: To endorse the dairy animal and to promote the natural fiber-- Cotton; and a fashion parade of imaginatively attired youth exhibitors and well- behaved 100% dairy cattle and 100% dairy goat females. No Boer Goats (full blood or percentage) are allowed.
3. The contest will be judged on modern fashionable dress selected, which must be attractive and lend style to the class. The garment worn must be made of a fabric containing a **minimum of 60% Cotton**.
4. Dairy cattle and dairy goats must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter and must be shown at the 2017 San Bernardino County Fair.
5. If deemed necessary by the fair management, two age group or animal classes may be formed after entries close.
6. Garments may be worn only once at this fair by the same exhibitor.
7. **Commentary must be turned in by May 22, 2020, 9:00 PM**

Lads & Lassies Wool Fashion Show

Lads & Lassies Wool Fashion Show Guidelines:

1. Entry Fee: \$3.00
2. The object of this class is two-fold: a fashion parade of imaginatively attired young Lads & Lassies and well-behaved halter led sheep.
3. The contestant will be judged on modern fashionable dress selected, which must be attractive and lend style to the class. The garment must be made of wool or at least 70% wool blend, or by-products of sheep. All wool must be natural or natural wool blend. No synthetic wool's (man-made) will be allowed.
4. Sheep must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter. All rules for exhibiting sheep at the San Bernardino County Fair shall govern.
5. Winners will be eligible for the 2017 California State Fair Lads and Lassies Competition.
6. Garments may be worn only once at this fair by the same exhibitor.
7. **Commentary must be turned in by May 22, 2020, 9:00 PM**

Guys & Gals Leather Fashion Show

Guys & Gals Leather Fashion Show Guidelines:

1. Entry Fee: \$3.00
2. The object of this class is two-fold; fashion parade of imaginatively attired young guys & gals and well-behaved halter-led beef. Contestants will be judged on modern fashionable attire, which must be attractive and lend style to the class. The garment must be made of Leather or Suede or other beef by-products. NO synthetic (man-made) Leather or Suede may be used.
3. Beef must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter.
4. All rules for exhibiting beef at the San Bernardino County Fair shall govern.
5. Garments may be worn only once at this fair by the same exhibitor.
6. **Commentary must be turned in by May 22, 2020, 9:00 PM**

Division 409—Guys & Gals Leather Fashion Show

1. **All Entries (ages 9-19 yrs. old)**

Bling a Pig Guidelines:

1. Entry Fee: \$3.00
2. Contestants will be judged on style, fashion and creativity.
3. All animals must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show.
4. Judging standard based on creativity of idea, costume and presentation.
5. Pigs Only
6. Contest may be split into 2 groups if fair management deems it necessary.
7. Garments may be worn only once at this fair by the same exhibitor.
8. No harmful glues or adhesives to be used on animal
9. Exhibitor and pig to be judged as a pair.
10. **Commentary must be turned in by May 22, 2020, 9:00 PM**

Dog Costume Contest

Entry Fee: \$3.00 per Entry per Class.

Contestants will be judged on style, fashion and creativity. Dogs must be conditioned, groomed and trained to show on leash. Dogs' costumes should coordinate with contestants. Exhibitors DO NOT have to enter dog show to enter in the dog costume contest.

Skill –A-Thon

Skill –A-Thon Guidelines:

1. Contest is open to all Youth exhibitors
2. Enter ringside 30 minutes prior to the designated start time for competition (See master schedule)
3. Please include age at time of entry.
4. Stations may include but are not limited to: identification of parts, breeds, cuts of meat, tools and equipment, etc. and demonstration of skills livestock skills (haltering an animal, giving an injection, candling an egg, putting together large animal clippers, showing a rabbit, etc.
5. Livestock skill-a-thon is a chance for exhibitors to show their knowledge of their projects. 4-H, FFA, Grange and independent youth exhibitors compete together. Exhibitors will be tested on basic knowledge of their species.
6. Awards will be given to the Overall High Senior (age 14 and above) and Overall High Junior (age 7-13)

Mini Contests

Mini Contests Guidelines:

1. Exhibitor ages: 2 thru 8 years of age
2. This is a fun event for the younger members of Livestock families exhibiting at the 2020 San Bernardino Fair.
3. ALL SPECIES ELIGIBLE (except Beef & Horses).
4. Goats may be brought to fairgrounds on day of the show prior to 9:00 am.
5. All participants will receive an award.
6. Contest may be split by specie, by fair management, if enough interest is shown at the time entries close.
