ENTRY MAXIMUM: TWO (2) ENTRIES PER EXHIBITOR PER CLASS

Rules and Information:

1. All exhibits must be produced by the exhibitor.
2. Electricity exhibits must be complete and in operating condition where applicable.
3. When necessary exhibits are to be mounted on a base for structural support and proper presentation.
4. Rocketry projects are to be entered in the "Any Other" class.
5. Metalworking and Woodworking projects must include a description card stating cost of material, labor to construct, etc.
6. This show is for exhibitors 9 years of age and older. For exhibitors under 9 years of age, see Primary Creative Exhibits.
7. Danish System of Judging
8. Fair management reserves the right to combine or cancel any classes that have three or fewer entries.

ENTRY MAXIMUM: ONE (1) ENTRIES PER EXHIBITOR PER CLASS

Rules and Information:

1. Entry Deadline-**ON-LINE** is Friday, April 23, 2021 for participating in the Ag Mechanic Silent Auction
2. Projects to be auctioned must have been entered in this year's Junior Mechanical Science Division 2050 or 2051.
3. Submit the sale price with your online entry.
4. Only projects that receive a blue ribbon are eligible to sell.
5. All projects sold will be assessed an auction cost fee of 6% which will be used to defray auction costs. Checks will be mailed to the exhibitor within 30 days of the close of the fair.
6. Students selling projects are obligated to help with the auction activities during the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on May 30 and May 31 during the auction.
7. Only projects made in school under the supervision of a vocational instructor or sanctioned 4-H project may be entered.
There will be no independent entries.
8. Students must be present during project judging.
9. Only 1st place judged project will be eligible to sell in the auction.
10. Projects exhibited must have been started and completed during the current school/project year. Due to COVID entries produced during the 2020 school are eligible however it must have been under the supervision of vocational instructor or sanctioned 4-H project. Projects made from assembly kits are not eligible. Component parts should be made by the exhibitor whenever possible.
11. Failure to comply with the Silent Auction Rules will result in a student's ineligibility to participate in the auction.
12. Items that have declared for sale will be moved into the area adjacent to the Junior Livestock Auction arena on sale day. Exhibitors are responsible to move their item to barn by 9:00 a.m. Sunday, May 30th.
13. No "**For Sale**" signs will be allowed, however exhibitors may display a poster, no bigger than 8 ½" x 11", with a description of their project. Failure to follow this rule will result in the item not being included in the silent auction.

14. It is the responsibility to be promoted by the exhibitor; advisor and/or teachers of the exhibitor.
15. The Sacramento County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Committee provides buyers with a photo of the seller/ exhibitor. Photos are to be of the exhibitor only. Exhibitor is to be from the waist up to the top of their head. Please submit photos based on the following requirements:
 - A. **All** exhibitors (4-H, FFA, Grange AND Independent) who enter Grading animals must present a photograph of themselves in their appropriate complete uniform (as described in the *Uniforms* section located in the preceding pages). If you have questions as to your organization's uniform; please contact your organization headquarters.
 - B. Leaders, Advisors, Independent Exhibitors: Contact Karen Hein at (916) 261-4250 to schedule a time to have your exhibitor's picture or organizations pictures taken digitally. Silent Auction Bids

1. All bidders need to have a registered buyer number issued through the Junior Livestock Office. Bidder numbers can be requested prior to Auction Day and picked up on auction day or obtained at the Buyer's registration table on auction day.
 2. Bids for the auction will be accepted on Auction Day, Sunday, May 30 from 8:00 a.m. and closing at 4:00 p.m.
 3. The Winners of the Silent Auction Item will be posted at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 30 at the payment area of the Junior Livestock Auction area.
 4. All silent auction items **must be paid** in full by 7:00 p.m. on Sunday May 30. Failure to do so will result in item going to the next highest bidder.
 5. Winning bidders who have paid for their items per item 3 above can pick up the item on Monday May 31, from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., or make arrangements with the Fair Manager for pick up on Tuesday, June 1.
 6. **All** exhibitors (4-H, FFA, Grange AND Independent) who are selling a ag mechanics project must have a photograph of themselves taken in their appropriate complete uniform (as described in the *Uniforms* section located in the preceding pages).
