San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo Fairgrounds

This Match is open to all currently registered members of Texas 4-H and Texas FFA Programs.

Check in Opens at 8:30 am

The 3-D Match will feature a California Start for 2019. Shooters may enter the course in groups beginning at 9am. No shooters will be allowed to begin shooting after 11:00am.

The Indoor Mod 600 match will begin promptly at 3:00 pm on the floor of the Spur Arena.

Awards

Awards will be tabulated and presented in the arena at the end of the Mod 600 Match.

Trophy Buckles will be awarded to the High Overall Archer in each Bow Class/Division.

Prize packages will be awarded to 2nd - 5th Places.

High Overall is determined by a weighted score of the 2 events. Archers must shoot both events to be eligible for High Overall. Weight formula will be posted on the day of the event. Any ties will be broken in order of 10X's, 10's, 9's, 8's, and so forth.

Designated 3-D targets have been sponsored for additional youth prizes.

Match Description

A 30 Target 3-D Round of 360 possible points. The course will follow an outdoor and indoor path through the fairgrounds. Designated 3-D targets have been sponsored for additional youth prizes. These targets are marked with signage and WILL NOT count towards point total.

An Indoor Mod-600 Round of 600 possible points

The arena floor will be compacted and utilize AC.

Ties will be broken on 10X's, 10's, 9's, 8's, and so forth.

Matches will be conducted under the 2019 Texas 4-H Shooting Sports Games Handbook unless otherwise noted here. The SASSRA Event Chairman and staff reserve the right to make any changes necessary to rule, guidelines or scoring decisions.

Age Divisions

All competitors must meet all requirements for participation in the San Angelo Stock Show program as outlined in the General Rules & Regulations. Divisions are based on 2018-19 school year enrollment.

Junior – Minimum age of 8 and enrolled in grades 3, 4, 5

Intermediate – Grade 6, 7 and 8

Senior – Grade 9, 10, 11, and 12; Shooters who graduated in 2019 are eligible to compete.

Equipment Classes

Archers will be limited to 1 bow class for this event.

All bows must be in safe working order. A maximum draw weight of 60 lbs on any bow will be strictly enforced. No cross bows. The Match Superintendent may be contacted prior to the match to answer questions or inspect equipment for suitability.

Arrows must be in good condition and may not exceed a 23/64th diameter. Arrows will be verified at check in. All arrows will use target tips. No hunting style tips will be brought onto the premises.

Barebow (traditional, longbow or recurve) – Bows may not be equipped with sights or sighting marks. Bows may have a simple prong rest. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.

Recurve – Bows may be equipped with a single sighting device, single pin, multiple pin or hunting style sights; may not be equipped with string peeps or string marks for rear sights. Laser or other holographic sights which paint a target will not be allowed. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.

NASP – This class is utilizing NASP equipment only. Genesis bows with no sights or sighting marks and no stabilizers. Mechanical release aids are not permitted. Original Genesis or Genesis Mini's are included. Genesis Pros, Genesis X's or Genesis Cuda will not be permitted in NASP Class. Only Easton 1820 30" arrows are allowed in the class. The original white nocking point may have been replaced with a single brass nocking point or a string tied nocking point.

Compound Unaided – Mechanical release aides are not permitted. Bows may not be equipped with magnified sights or stabilizers. Bows may be equipped with a single or multiple pin fixed sight. Bows may not be equipped with a peep sight. Laser or other holographic sights which paint a target will not be allowed.

Compound Aided – Bows may be equipped with magnified sights and stabilizers. Laser or other holographic sights which paint a target will not be allowed. Mechanical release aids are permitted.

Sights which incorporate a range finder will not be permitted in any bow class.

Hearing protection is not required for archery events, but may be used to minimize noise at the shooter's discretion.

Safety glasses are not required for archery events but may be used at the shooter's discretion. Sun glasses may be worn at the shooter's discretion.

All Archers must wear 4-H appropriate shirts with sleeves and closed toed shoes on all courses. Collared shirts are not required. Caps are optional. Shooters may turn baseball cap brims to the rear while shooting, but must wear them correctly at all other times.

Targets

Mod 600

A full color, 122 cm target with ten equal concentric scoring rings

Course of Fire:

Juniors – 3 ends of 6 arrows at 30 yds, 3 ends of 6 arrows at 25 yds and 8 ends of 3 arrows at 20 yds; total of 60 arrows.

Intermediates - 3 ends of 6 arrows at 50 yds, 3 ends of 6 arrows at 40 yds and 8 ends of 3 arrows at 30 yds; total of 60 arrows.

Seniors - 3 ends of 6 arrows at 60 yds, 3 ends of 6 arrows at 50 yds and 8 ends of 3 arrows at 40 yds; total of 60 arrows.

Time Limits

Shooters have a total of 4 minutes to shoot each end of six arrows and 2 minutes to shoot each end of three arrows.

Scoring: The lines between the scoring areas of the target are part of the higher value scoring area. A shaft touching a scoring line receives the higher value score. From the center of the target outward, the scoring areas are 10x, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1. Shots outside the scoring area are recorded as misses.

3-D – 30 Reinhart 3-D Targets

Adults will be squadded with youth shooters. The adult should be the last person to shoot each target.

Course of Fire:

Barebow and NASP equipment classes

Juniors will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 20 yds.

Intermediates will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 25 yds.

Seniors will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 30 yds.

Recurve equipment classes

Juniors will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 20 yds

Intermediates will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 25 yds

Seniors will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 40 yds

Compound Aided and Unaided

Juniors will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 30 yds

Intermediates will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 40 yds

Seniors will shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 50 yds

Bonus Targets:

Designated 3-D targets have been sponsored for additional prizes. These targets are marked with signage and WILL NOT count towards point total. These targets may have unconventional set ups.

Optics: Binoculars are allowed. Range finders or similar devices including cell phone apps will not be permitted.

Time limits: The 3-D Match will feature a California Start for 2019. Shooters may enter the course in groups beginning at 9:00am. No shooters will be allowed to begin shooting after 11:00 am. No posted time limits are set, shooters must make ready and shoot in an expeditious manner. Time to judge range, determine kill zone location, adjust sights and otherwise make ready will be provided, but no shooter will impose excessive delay without due cause. A maximum of 2 minutes searching time is permitted for any lost arrow.

Scoring: 12pts for center of vital zone (x), 10 pts for heart/inner vital zone, 5pts for vital zone, Hit recorded for anywhere on the target outside of the vital zone, Miss recorded for missing the target completely. Bounce outs, pass through or clean misses will be scored as Misses. The lines between scoring zones on the target are part of the higher value scoring area.

Tabulation:

Targets will be scored by the archers on each squad or with the assistance from a range officer (or other designated person) as necessary. Scores and totals must be verified by each shooter before arrows are touched or removed from the target. Any questions of scoring must be resolved before any arrow is touched or removed from the target.

All scorecards will be reviewed and verified by the scoring committee. Any questions or protests must be addressed BY THE SHOOTER to the Match Superintendent, designated Range Officers or the designated representative of San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo. SASSRA has the right to amend or change any rule to the event.
