Participants must have a \$5 Student Competition Ticket to enter the Fairgrounds unless they are already at the Fair for another competition. Agricultural Education instructors are responsible for ordering tickets directly from the State Fair Ticket Office.

Contest Rules

- 1. Information can be found on the Virginia FFA website http://www.vaffa.org.
- 2. This contest will be open to FFA chapters across the state. Schools are invited to enter one or two demonstrations. If two demonstrations are entered from a chapter, each must present a different demonstration topic.
- 3. Demonstrations may be presented by either one individual contestant or a team of two contestants. (Note that awards are presented to ranked demonstration, not individual contestants.)
- 4. Contestants must be active students in grades 6-12 the school term preceding entry in the contest. There will be two divisions: **Division I** will be students in grades 6-9 and **Division II** will be students in grades 10-12. If either member of a team is in or above the tenth grade level, the team will be considered Division II.
- 5. No individual may present the same demonstration in successive years.
- 6. No individual may present the same demonstration as presented in the horticulture demonstration contest.
- 7. Presentations must be of a demonstration nature (actually doing something), not simply an illustrated talk.
- 8. Demonstration topics may deal with agriculture within any of the following areas: Plant and Soil Science, Animal Science, Agricultural Marketing & Agricultural Business, Natural Resources Management & Environmental Science, and Agricultural Engineering.
- 9. Fire, live animals and operational engines may not be used during the demonstration.
- 10. Each demonstration is limited to 10 minutes. Following the demonstration, the judges (only) may ask questions of the contestant and only about the demonstration.
- 11. A table, easel, and microphone will be provided. Contestants must provide all equipment and materials required for their demonstrations.
- 12. Contestants must provide a sign (poster board) with contestant name, school name and demonstration title for display during the presentation.
- 13. The contest will be limited to the first twenty teams/individuals to register.

Awards

The State Fair of Virginia will provide premiums and ribbons for the high individuals in Division I and II (middle school & high school) according to the following schedule:


