How to enter:

- Step 1: 4-H Leader or FFA Advisor will complete the group entry form. [<http://tinyurl.com/2019SFJDC>]
- Step 2: The superintendent will email the leader/advisor an Excel spreadsheet to enter names and other information for each contest and to make preliminary team assignments.
- Step 3: Leader/advisor will return the completed spreadsheet to the superintendent via email.
- Step 4: The superintendent will email the leader/advisor information needed to purchase tickets online at the \$5.00 discounted rate.
- Step 5: Leader/advisor will purchase tickets for all attending, students and chaperones.

Participants and coaches must have a \$5 Student/Competition Ticket to enter the Fair grounds unless they are already at the Fair for another competition.

Contest Objective

To provide an educational program for Virginia youth who are interested in improving and testing their knowledge of the dairy industry.

Contest Rules and Regulations

1. **Extension agents, 4-H volunteer leaders or agricultural education instructors are responsible for ordering tickets. Instructions for ordering tickets will be provided when the team registration is received.**
2. The Junior Dairymen's Contest is open to any bona fide 4-H or FFA member in Virginia. Contestants must be entered and certified by their local extension agent or agricultural education teacher prior to the entry deadline.
3. Students are not eligible if they have begun college prior to June 1 of current year.
4. Each county 4-H club or agriculture department is invited to enter up to five teams total (junior and senior divisions combined). Teams may consist of three or four members. When four members are entered, the three members with the highest overall individual scores will make up the team total. The fourth member will be the alternate. Alternates will be eligible for individual awards. In addition, any 4-H member or FFA member may judge as an individual contestant as long as he or she has been properly entered.
5. Junior contestants will be those who are 13 years old or younger by Sept. 30 of the current year. Senior contestants will be those who are 14-19 years old by Sept. 30 of the current year.
6. The Superintendent of the contest, in cooperation with the contest committee, will be in charge of the contest and will conduct it in compliance with these rules and regulations. He shall have the authority for the interpretation of the rules.

THE CONTEST:

1. All contestants and coaches will report to the Cattle Complex (First Bank & Trust Company Pavilion) at 10:45 a.m. Final instructions will be given and questions answered at this time.
2. The Superintendent will supply contestants with placing cards and any other necessary forms. No contestant will be allowed to take any books, notes, or pamphlets into the ring.
3. Twenty-five minutes will be allowed for the quiz. Fifteen minutes will be allowed for identification classes and DHIA questions. Twelve minutes will be allowed for judging classes.
4. While the contest is in session there SHALL BE NO COMMUNICATION among contestants and anyone else, except as designated by the superintendent or his assistants. Cell phones, PDA's, or other types of electronic communication may not be used by contestants while the contest is in progress. Violators will be penalized by having one or more scores disallowed.

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Determination of Ratings

1. The overall individual ranking shall be determined by adding contestant's scores.
2. The overall team ranking shall be determined by totaling all the scores of the three team members.
3. In case of a tie for individual or team awards, ranking will be determined by the team (individual) with the highest score in Class 1. If still tied, Class 2 will be used and so on until broken.

Classes

1. Written test of 50 questions250 points
 2. Identification of 10 pieces of dairy equipment50 points
 3. Identification of 10 pieces of cattle equipment50 points
 4. Identification of 10 grains, forages, silage or supplements commonly fed to dairy cows50 points
 5. Identification of 10 dairy products50 points
 6. Answer 10 questions on DHIA records50 points
 7. Judge a class of cows50 points
 8. Judge a class of heifers50 points
