### RULES

1. 4H exhibitors must be enrolled in their projects by June 15<sup>th</sup>.
2. Participants must enter in the appropriate age Division according to their grade during the 2018/2019 school year.
3. All exhibits must be a result of a 4-H learning experience during the current project year and should show a progression of skills from one year to the next.
4. Exhibitors may participate in interview judging on Entry Day
5. Exhibits are judged on the Danish System. Ribbons of blue (excellent), red (good), or white (worthy) will be awarded according to quality in comparison to an established standard.
6. Members in grades K-2 during the 2018/2019 school year are considered Cloverbud 4-H members and receive a rainbow ribbon and a \$1 premium per winning entry.
7. All exhibits must be clean, neat, and properly prepared for exhibition and judging. Substandard or improperly prepared exhibits or animals will not be accepted.
8. 4-H entries are subject to Fair entry rules and procedures.
9. **\*NEW\*** 3 entries will be accepted to each lot

### What is 4-H?

4-H is a community of young people across America who are learning citizenship, leadership, and life skills. It is the youth audience of the Cooperative Extension System in the United States. Youth in grades K-12 participate in individual and group learning experiences. 4-H leaders are considered volunteer staff members. At the local level, each district has a University of Alaska Extension Office, which administers the 4-H program. At the national level, 4-H is under the leadership of the United States Division of Agriculture.

### How does the 4-H program work?

*"It is better to build a child than to mend an adult."*

4-H is a learn-by-doing program. This 'experimental learning' occurs when youths participate in an activity, look back to reflect the activity, draw conclusions or observations from the experience, and relate the experience to past or future experiences in their lives. Through the experimental learning process, young people develop basic, transferable skills useful in real-life experiences today and in the future. Youths learn skills for living.

### What can you do in 4-H?

Members, with guidance from adult leaders, learn useful life skills to communicate with others and serve their community by practicing these skills in real-life situations. Adult leaders can participate in the Alaska 4-H leader's

**EDUCATIONAL DISPLAY**

Each Division offers the opportunity to enter an educational display. Individual displays are limited to a maximum of 72 inches in height, 26 inches in width and 30 inches in depth (front to back of display) when exhibited. Displays must be freestanding. Displays must reflect actual club-related work or projects; school-related projects should be entered to Division 20A – Education Showcase. A display may be 3-dimensional or a notebook. If you choose to do a poster, check Division 1J, Class F to see if submitting the poster in that Division is more appropriate.

Explanations should include how the exhibit was made or what was done in the project; operating instructions if appropriate; information sources; and what the member learned. Explanations must be complete to qualify the exhibit for judging.
