4-H HORSE SHOW: Aug 5-7.

ENTRIES: Registration must be submitted to the 4-H Office by 5:00 p.m., July 15, 2019. The show is operated under the rules and regulations found in the “**The Alaska 4-H Horse Show Rule Book**”. See Division 4 – Livestock- for General Livestock Rules and Division 5 – Equine – for rules pertaining to horses at the Fair. **All 4-H must have an Annual 4-H Horse Certification form on record with the Extension Office.**

STALL RESERVATIONS: All exhibitors wanting to reserve stall must have a copy of a current (2019), negative EIA (Coggins Test) turned into the 4-H Office by July 27-28, 2019. Stall reservations and cards will be filled out at the mandatory meeting on July 27 or July 28, 2019.

HEALTH: Proof of negative EIA (Coggins Test) is required for all equine animals on the Fairgrounds

DRESS CODE: Fitting and showing: All exhibitors are required to wear black pants, white, long-sleeved shirt (tucked in), belt, appropriate riding boots, and a western hat or an ASTM/SEI Approved riding helmet.

Western and English Class: Refer to **The Alaska 4-H Horse Rules Book** for attire appropriate for discipline. Chaps are prohibited in bareback equitation. Western Chaps are optional in Stock Seat Equitation, Trail, Reining, Gymkhana, and Western Games. English half chaps and paddock boots are allowed; however, boots must match chaps in black or brown.

Gymkhana and Western Games: Mandatory that a long-sleeved, tucked in shirt with buttons or snaps be worn. **No slinkies.** See page 27 of **The Alaska 4-H Horse Rules Book**. The only exception is for appropriate English attire when riding English type saddle

HELMETS: An ASTM and SEI approved riding helmet is required anytime a rider is mounted on a horse.

ELIGIBILITY: All Classes will be divided by rider ability: advanced, intermediate, beginner, and novice beginner. Novice Beginner is a walk/trot Class only and may not cross enter any Class requiring a canter/lope. Ability levels to be jointly determined by 4-H member, parent, and 4-H leader based on “**The Alaska 4-H Horse Show Rule Book**”. Riders showing over fences Class must enter and be riding at the intermediate hunt seat equitation level on the flat. Please see your 4-H leader or show manager for more information.

RULES: Read the General Rules and Regulations carefully, paying special attention to those dealing with livestock exhibits and equine barn rules.

PARKING: Vehicle entry for the purpose of caring for or exhibiting horses will be made only through the Green Gate (see Fairground map). This area is for Livestock and Equine exhibitors only. Livestock/Equine Parking will be as follows: \$3 per day for day parking only (no overnight), \$5 per day for a 20’ x 40’ space, and \$7 per day for a 20’ x 60’ space. **The Superintendents can arrange purchase of parking passes for exhibitors participating in Fair Halter. No parking passes will be sold through the Fair Office or at the gates.** Superintendents and Show Managers have reserved spaces. Failure to honor parking regulations will result in having your vehicle towed.

are to be used as guidelines for fair treatment of animals while on the property of the Tanana Valley State Fair Association. Exhibitors, owners, or responsible persons in possession of animals on the Tanana Valley State Fair Association property shall at all-time conduct themselves honestly and display good sportsmanship. TVSFA requires all exhibitors, owners, trainers, or responsible persons to be responsible for the care and management of their animals and to keep them healthy, clean, and safe.

SAFETY RULES:

1. Arenas close at 10 PM.
2. Proper headgear and footgear is required.
3. No riding double.
4. Handle horse in a safe manner.
5. Safety and courtesy required.
6. Animals must have proper care.
7. Stallions over six months old cannot be handled in 4-H.
8. Lead your horse outside arena areas.
9. A midnight curfew will apply to the livestock buildings, barns, and parking areas.
10. Quiet hours of 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. must be observed.

BARN AND STALL RULES:

1. No unauthorized motor vehicles in arenas or barns.
2. No smoking in barns or stall areas.
3. No advertising posted on stalls.
4. No personal padlocks on stalls.
5. No storage or feed outside of stalls.
6. Do not leave horse in stall with tack on.
7. No dogs allowed in barns or stall areas.
8. Horses and equipment must be stalled in appropriate areas.
9. **STALLS ARE TO BE CLEANED EACH DAY.** Cleaning means picking out manure and wet shavings. Bedding does not have to be taken down to rock or sand, except when a horse is checked out of the Fairgrounds.
If you leave your stall dirty, you will be charged a FEE to have it cleaned. This is your responsibility and part of the program.
10. Manure must be deposited in designated area only

4-H FAIR CHAMPION OR RESERVE CHAMPION AWARDS:

Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in all ability levels for Class A, B, and C only. To qualify for these awards exhibitors must compete in the following:

Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced

Riders:

- Western Rider- Class B, Classes 1, 2, 3, & 4
- English Rider - Class C Classes 1, 2, 3, & 4

Novice Beginner:

- Western Rider - Class B Classes 2, 3, & 4
- English Rider – Class C Classes 2, 3, &

4-H OVERALL CHAMPION OR RESERVE CHAMPION AWARDS:

To qualify for these awards exhibitors must compete in the following:

Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced Riders:

- Class A Classes 1, 2, and 3
- Class B Classes 1, 2, 3, and 4
- Class C Classes 1, 2, 3, and 4

Novice Beginner:

- Class A Classes 1, 2, and 3
- Class B Classes 2, 3, and 4
- Class C Classes 2, 3, and 4

Freestyle pattern requirements, Dressage tests, and Reining pattern can be obtained from the Tanana District 4-H office or the 4-H Horse Fair Show Committee. Special Fair Theme ribbons will be given to clubs that participate in decorating stalls in the Fair theme. The Tanana Valley State Fair Association will award one herdsmanship ribbon and a premium for each exhibitor's average score.

FAIR HALTER SHOW

Wednesday, August 7th, 6 pm

ENTRIES: You must have an ID number issued by the Fair Office. Use this number when filling out your entry form. **Refer to Livestock Entry Rules at the beginning of Division 4.** You may also mail your entry to the Fair Office; send it Attn: Equine Superintendent. Entries must be received by Friday, July 28 2019.

If Class have under 3 participants Classes will be combined

STALL RESERVATIONS: All exhibitors wishing to reserve stalls must have the following items turned into the Stall Manager on Entry Day. You may also turn these items to the Fair Office prior to Entry Day--

- 1) Stall cards (one needed for each animal entered).
- 2) Copy of negative EIA (Coggins test). This will not be returned. The test must have been done within the current year.
- 3) \$20 deposit check per stall (no cash).

Late Reservations will be charged \$10 per stall per day. Stall check-in will be through the Stall Manager starting the evening of Thursday, August 4th. The Stall Manager's hours will be posted on Entry Day. Stalls may be reserved only for horses that are entered Fair shows. Stalls are to be used **ONLY** by horses that are exhibited at the Fair during the time.

PARKING: Vehicle entry for the purpose of caring for or exhibiting horses will be made only through the Green Gate (see Fairground map). This area is for Livestock and Equine exhibitors only. Livestock/Equine Parking will be as follows: \$3 per day for day parking only (no overnight); \$5 per day for a 20' x 40' space; and \$7 per day for a 20' x 60' space. **Purchase of parking passes for exhibitors participating in Fair Halter can be arranged through the Show Manager. No parking passes will be sold through the Fair Office or at the gates.** Superintendents and Show Managers have reserved spaces. Failure to honor parking regulations will result in having your vehicle towed. **You must have a valid day pass and parking pass to be allowed entrance through the Green Gate, No Exceptions.**

SAFETY RULES
