Class A ----- Reduce!

To Reduce means to use fewer things and produce less waste. Reduce by repairing broken items rather than buying new. Reduce by using a durable object instead of a disposable one. Reduce by coming up with a plan to use less energy.

- Lot 1 How can we reduce? Write an essay/song/poem/story.
Lot 2 Create a poster or display about "reducing".
Lot 3 Show or write about a way to reduce energy use.
Lot 4 Show or write about a way to reduce water consumption.
Lot 5 Show or write about a way to reduce land use.
Lot 6 Repair something.

- Lot 7 Create a durable item to replace a disposable item.

Class B ----- Reuse!

To Reuse means to use something again instead of throwing it away. Reuse an item by using it again for its original purpose or by inventing a new use for it.

- Lot 1 What can we reuse? Write an essay/song/poem/story.
Lot 2 Create a poster or display about "reusing".
Lot 3 Create an arts-and-crafts item from reused objects.
Lot 4 Create a toy from reused items.
Lot 5 Create a quilt from reused Cloth.
Lot 6 Create clothing from reused materials.
Lot 7 Create jewelry/personal accessories from reused items.

- Lot 9 Nine-Lives! What are nine ways that one item can be reused? Write about it or show examples.
- Lot 10 Create a musical instrument from reused materials.
- Lot 11 Create a mobile or wind chimes from reused materials.
- Lot 12 Create a bag, purse, or carryall from reused materials.

Class C -----Recycle!

To recycle means to break down an item into its original components, that is then reconstructed into something useful. You recycle old paper when you blend it with water and glues to make new paper or when you compost yard waste into new soil. Aid recycling efforts by making a collection bin or invent something new made from recycled materials.

- Lot 1 Why should we recycle? Write an essay/song/poem/story.
- Lot 2 Create a poster or display about “recycling”.
- Lot 3 Recycle paper.
- Lot 4 Write about or show how to compost yard waste.
- Lot 5 Create a collection bin for a recyclable item.
- Lot 6 Write a report about a recyclable item.
- Lot 7 Invent an item made from recycled materials.
