



She graduated from Fort Elliot CISD where she was active in 4-H and FFA, cheerleading, golf, National Honor Society and Student Council. She served as the Top O Texas district vice president and her high school chapter president for two years. She showed Limousin heifers all over the U.S. and competed in Homesite Evaluation in FFA. McKinley will be attending West Texas A&M University in the fall to pursue a degree in agriculture education.

Macie Mimms is the daughter of Mike and Tamara Mimms from Hereford. She graduated from Hereford High School where she was involved in FFA, competing in livestock judging, chapter conducting, radio broadcasting and public relations. New Shade Structure Ribbon Cutting

Members of the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce, Amarillo Tri-State Exposition, Potter County, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and Xcel Energy were on hand July 19 to cut the ribbon on a new shade structure. The structure was funded by the American Academy of Dermatology, supported by Dr. Larry Roberts, Canyon, and sits in the Xcel energy Park at the main entrance (Gate 1) to the fairgrounds.

"The Xcel Energy Park is all ready for use, just in time for the Fair," said Maryann Hueston, director of development and fundraising. "With the support of the American Academy of Dermatology, we now have a shade ramada where people can rest and cool off after a walk from the parking lot or wait for the trolley. The ramada will be used for the Ag Education program during the Fair. It will also be used by 4-H youth, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension programs and campers on the Expo grounds."


