The annual board meeting of the Amarillo Tri-State Exposition was held on March 8. Over 100 board members and guests attended the annual meeting and dinner held in the Commercial Exhibits Hall.

Jeff Jackson with Wilson, Hagg & Co. completed the annual audit. He indicated that everything looks good and the Exposition is very strong.

Dr. Bob Robinson spoke on behalf of the scholarship committee and let everyone know that with donors and the communities support the Exposition was able to offer four \$6,000 scholarships in 2015.

Committee chairmen gave committee updates and shared plans for 2016. Some of the highlights included:

- Long Range Planning: Glenn McMennamy reported on the improvements on the grounds and WiFi that will soon be installed.
- Volunteer Program: Maryann Hueston shared that over 600 volunteers provided around 13,000 hours of service in 2015.

They are: Tom Spanel, president, Mark Zimmer, president elect, Virgil Bartlett, secretary, Jim Jennings, treasurer and Dennis Horn, treasurer elect.
- Virgil Bartlett introduced the “2016 Volunteer of the Year,” Jonathan Ware. As a new board member, Jonathan contributed over 130 hours of volunteer service. He took on the job of coordinating the Ag Education programs held during the fair.

Virgil concluded his reports by updating the crowd on the roofing projects with the Rex Baxter, Bill Cody Arena and Food Court. He also thanked Robert Devin for his years of service as an officer.

Robert expressed his gratitude to not only the office staff and outside staff but also to the committees, their coordinators and to those that mentored him in his leadership role as an officer.
