Released: Barrows, except those selected for the Junior Livestock Auction, will be released upon conclusion of their breed show. Must be out by 8 pm on Wednesday, October 7.

Entry Deadline: Entry and payment must be submitted online by August 28, 2020, 12 midnight. Legal Release Form and Online Receipt must be postmarked mailed by September 1, 2020. Nomination does not constitute entry.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. Non Terminal Show:** The Tulsa State Fair Junior Market Barrow Show is a non-terminal show, with the exception of the Junior Livestock Auction barrows.
- 2. Read General Rules:** All junior exhibitors are expected to adhere to the General Rules, Show Ring Code of Ethics, Health and Sanitary Regulations, and the Junior General Rules and Regulations.
- 3. Nominations:** Market barrows showing at the Tulsa State Fair must have nomination information submitted online and mail DNA sample to the Tulsa State Fair office postmarked by July 1, 2020. For junior market animal nomination and entry procedure, please refer to Junior General Rules and Regulations and the Nomination page on the Tulsa State Fair website.
- 4. Ear Tags:** All barrows must have the ear tag issued at nomination properly in the ear when entering the showing.
- 5. Retag:** There will be a \$5 retag fee at the time of check in if you have not retagged before the show.
- 6. Show Limit:** There is no limit on the number of barrows an exhibitor may enter. However, each exhibitor can only show a total of three (3) barrows, regardless of the number of head entered. Any one animal may not enter or show in two different breeds.
- 7. Ownership:** All barrows must be owned, cared for daily and fed by the exhibitor from July 1.
- 8. Weigh-In:**
 - a. There will be no official weigh-in of Market Barrows. Complimentary scales will be available for weigh-in.
 - b. Each exhibitor for ALL breeds will be responsible for declaring his/her animal's weight and entering the weight into the Swine Kiosk before 8 pm, Monday, October 5. This weight will be declared class weight. Show classification weight will range from 230 to 280 pounds.
 - c. Complimentary scales in the Explorer Barn will be provided for weighing. Scales will be calibrated by show officials daily. Weighing on the official scales in the show ring will not be permitted.
 - d. The show officials will weigh barrows prior to entering the main show ring. Any barrow which weighs more than 10 pounds from weight listed on Official Show Weight Card will be disqualified. Any barrow weighing less than 230 pounds on the day they show will be disqualified.
- 9. Class Breaks:** Class breaks will be determined by show management. Every effort will be made not to put more than 35 head per class. Large breeds may be broken into divisions if there are 8 or more classes in the breed.
- 10.  Breed Eligibility:** Any breed that falls below 20 for more than 3 years in a row will be evaluated and considered for elimination.
- 11. Arena Promptness:** Each barrow must be driven into the judging ring promptly when called.
- 12. Class:** If an animal is exhibited in the wrong class that entry will be disqualified. After the judge enters the main show arena, after sifting the class, no other entry will be accepted in that class.
- 13. Grooming:** Only water will be permitted in the holding area. No color grooming compound will be allowed. If a color compound is detected, the exhibitor and his/her animal will be disqualified.

14. **Applied or Ingestible Substances:** Water is the only allowable applied or ingestible substance permitted in the holding area and show ring. All other compounds detected will be grounds for disqualification.
15. **Washing of Animals:** All animals must be washed in a designated wash rack. No washing outside of barn.
16. **Stalling:** Pens will be pre-assigned by the designated Superintendent by FFA Chapter and 4-H County. No pens will be permitted to be built outside of barn. Divider panels are not provided by the show. You will need to bring your own divider panels and means to secure. Management reserves the right to reassign unused pens or tack pens to pen animals. The building of additional pens in any location other than assigned pens is prohibited.
17. **Restraint:** No barrow will be permitted to be restrained with a nose snare.
18. **Injured Animal:** When the judge determines that an animal can no longer compete without endangering itself, said animal will be disqualified, and the next highest placing animal in that class or preliminary sale order will be brought in to replace the injured animal.
19. **Selection of Junior Livestock Auction:** The number of barrows that qualify for the sale will be based on the total number of barrows entered in the show. 40 barrows will be selected for the sale. The number of barrows selected by the judge in each breed for the premium sale will be on a percentage basis of the total number shown. The minimum number of head for a breed to have at least one animal eligible for the sale is equal to the total number of head exhibited, divided by sale spots, and then rounded to the nearest whole number. Breeds that have less than the minimum number of head, but more than 15 will show for breed champion honors only and only the champion will show for sale order with the crossbreds. Breeds with less than 15 will show as crossbreds. Example: In 2018 a total of 716 barrows were exhibited. To get the required number per breed, you would take the total number divided by 40, ($716/40 = 17.9$), then round to the nearest whole number, (18). In order for any breed to have a guaranteed spot in the sale, that breed would have to have at least 18 animals exhibited. If there were only 17 animals, the champion and only the champion of that breed would show for sale order with the crossbreds. Only the Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, Breed Champions, and Reserve Breed Champions are required to sell. All other sale qualifying barrows can be removed from the sale within 30 minutes after the conclusion of the breed sale order line up. The exhibitor must sign the official Sale Removal Form to remove a barrow from the sale.
20. **Junior Livestock Auction Meeting:** There will be a gathering for all Junior Livestock Auction participants immediately following the barrow show at the Swine Arena. It is a requirement that each Junior Livestock Auction participant be present. Any and all instructions concerning the Junior Livestock Auction will be given at this time. The Swine Committee will be available in the Junior Livestock Auction Area to answer any questions or be of any help to the exhibitor Thursday.
21. **YQCA Requirements:** Exhibitors will not be required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, (YQCA), or prior to the 2020 Tulsa State Fair; however all exhibitors are encouraged to do so.
22. **Breeds:** The Tulsa State Fair has chosen to recognize the breeds and classification standards as specified. Barrows entered as a purebred breed that does not meet the classification standards must be moved to the crossbred division at time of kiosk check in. The barrow will only be moved into the crossbred division and not into another breed section. Barrows nominated as a crossbred will not be permitted to move into another breed.
23. **Premiums:** 1st - \$50, 2nd - \$45, 3rd - \$40, 4th - \$35, 5th - \$35, 6th - \$30, 7th - \$25, 8th - \$25, 9th - \$20, 10th - \$20

SPECIAL - The National Swine Registry will offer \$1,000 to the Grand Champion Barrow of the junior market hog show if this animal is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, or Yorkshire barrow. The exhibitor must have a transferred pedigree of the Grand Champion Barrow and must present it to the NSR representative at the time of exhibition. This barrow must submit to a DNA verification test. A representative of the National Swine Registry must be present at the time of DNA sampling.

SPECIAL - The National Swine Registry will offer \$500 to the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow of the junior market hog show if this animal is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, or Yorkshire barrow. The exhibitor must have a transferred pedigree of the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow and must present it to the NSR representative at the time of exhibition. This barrow must submit to a DNA verification test. A representative of the National Swine Registry must be present at the time of DNA sampling.

BARROW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

These are the recognized breeds for the Tulsa State Fair. Barrows must meet all classification standards as established by the Breed Associations. No pedigrees will be required.

DIVISION 134 — BERKSHIRE

1. A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character.
2. A Berkshire must have white on at least three legs, face and tail (unless tail is docked).
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.

4. From the base of the head forward, a Berkshire cannot be solid white.
5. Must not have an area of white skin that exceeds 93.5 square inches of contiguous solid white on the upper 2/3 of the body.
6. Must not have a spotted or mottling pattern larger than a contiguous 93.5 square inches area anywhere on the body.

DIVISION 135 — CHESTER WHITE

1. Must possess Chester White Breed characteristics.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
4. Any skin pigmentation other than white that exceeds five in number is disqualified.
5. Ears must be down and medium size.
6. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DIVISION 136 — DUROC

1. Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed character. Ears must be down.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
4. Must NOT have any black hair.
5. Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
6. Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.
7. Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
8. There are no underline requirements to exhibit Duroc barrows as market animals.

DIVISION 137— HAMPSHIRE

1. Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body. Animal is eligible if it has a black head and the body is totally white.
2. Must possess Hampshire breed character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
5. Must NOT have any red hair.
6. Must NOT have any evidence of an extra dewclaw.
7. Must be stress negative.
8. There are no underline requirements to exhibit Hampshire barrows as market animals.

DIVISION 138 – HEREFORD

1. Must have at least 50% white face.
2. Must have at least 50% red body.
3. Must have at least two white feet.

DIVISION 139 — POLAND CHINA

1. Must possess Poland China breed characteristics.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be black with six white points (face, feet and tail) with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one black leg and be determined as a Poland China. (Tail docking is permissible eliminating that white point.)
4. Must have ears down.
5. Must NOT have evidence of belt formation either white or white skin encircling and touching the points of the shoulder extending down on both sides of the animal to the depth of the elbow pocket.
6. Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
7. Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering with possible ear tags are ineligible.

DIVISION 140 — SPOTTED

1. Must be black and white.
2. Must possess spotted breed characteristics.
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. Ears cannot be erect.
5. Any red tinted or brown spots are ineligible.
6. No solid black head from ears forward.
7. No white belt pattern (hair or skin) that encompasses the back one third of both shoulder blades and extends down to

the foreleg of the animal. The belt pattern is not completely broken by black. Exception to this rule is a predominantly white-bodied individual with a white face.

8. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DIVISION 141 — YORKSHIRE

1. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed character. (Ears must be erect)
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any colored hair except white.
4. Must NOT have more than two pigmentation spots larger than a US minted dime or one pigmentation spot larger than a US minted quarter. These pigmentation spots, (combined), can NOT exceed a US minted silver dollar.
5. Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
6. Must be stress negative.
7. There are no underline requirements to record and exhibit Yorkshire barrows as market animals.

DIVISION 142 — CROSSBRED

1. Any barrow that does not classify into a breed listed.
