Released: Wednesday, October 7. All steers, except those selected for the Junior Livestock Auction, will be released upon conclusion of their breed show and must be out by 8 pm on Wednesday, October 7.

Entry Deadline: Entry and payment must be submitted online by August 28, 2020. Legal Release Form and Online Receipt must be postmarked mailed and by September 1, 2020. Nomination does not constitute entry.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. Read General Rules:** Junior exhibitors are expected to adhere to the General Rules and Regulations, Show Ring code of Ethics and Animal Health Regulations as well as the Junior General Rules and Regulations.
- 2. Nominations:** Market Steers showing at the Tulsa State Fair must have nomination information submitted online and mail DNA sample to the Tulsa State Fair office postmarked by July 1, 2020. Photos must be submitted online. For detailed junior market animal nomination and entry procedure, please refer to Junior General Rules and Regulations and the Nomination page on the Tulsa State Fair website.
- 3. Ownership:** Exhibitors must be the sole owner of any animals shown in his/her name and must have owned, cared for daily and fed steers from no later than the date nominated.
- 4. Show Limit:** An exhibitor may show a maximum of three steers. No steer will be allowed to show in two different breeds.
- 5.  Classification:** The exhibitor must declare the breed at time of nomination. Final determination of breed classification will be made by the classification committee appointed by Show Management. Breed determination is based on visible steer characteristics only; there will be no registration papers or breeders certificates considered. ALL steers are subject to a final classification upon arrival at the show. If a steer does not meet breed classification, it will move to the crossbred division. Steers nominated as a crossbred will not be permitted to move into another breed. The judgment of the classifiers is final and not subject to protest.
- 6.  Classifiers:** The Tulsa State Fair will have three classifiers who will determine the official breed classification of each steer. The judgment of classifiers is final and not subject to protest.
- 7. Weigh-In:** There will be no official weigh-in of Market Steers. Each exhibitor will be responsible for declaring his/her animal's weight at the Kiosk Station or by phone no later than Tuesday, October 6, 2 pm. Kiosks will be available on Tuesday, October 6 from 12 pm – 2 pm. Minimum weight will be 1,000 pounds. There will be no maximum weight.
- 8. Retag:** Steers will be retagged at 10 am on Tuesday, October 6 in OFD Arena 2. There will be a \$5 retag fee if you have not retagged before the show.
- 9. Weigh-Back:** There will be a weigh-back in class of the top three steers with a 5% variance allowed.
- 10. Class Breaks:** Classes will be established and posted after all steers are weighed.
- 11. Tie-Outs:** A limited number of tie-outs will be sold on a first come first serve basis. Tie outs may be purchased at the time of entry or from the Livestock Office upon arrival, pending availability. Tie outs will be assigned prior to arrival. Tie-out time will be 7 pm each day. Steers must be tied in the barn between 8 am and 7 pm.
- 12. Hair:** No alteration or simulation with respect to color or hair will be permitted on any animals entered in the Junior Shows. (This includes all products, natural or man-made, false switch permitted.) If alteration or addition is detected by a show official or through a protest, the exhibitor will be disqualified and barred from exhibiting for one year.
- 13. Stalls:** Stalls will be assigned by county. No stalls will be used for any purpose other than to stall competing livestock.
- 14. Bedding Removal:** Bedding is provided in the cattle stalls. Removal of the bedding for tack or feed is prohibited.
- 15. Equipment:** Tack and feed must be stored in the tack aisle. No generators, port-a-cools, or aisle fans will be allowed.
- 16. Grooming Chutes:** Due to limited space, the use of grooming chutes is discouraged. Grooming chute passes may be purchased for \$50 at the time of entry or in the Livestock Office. For safety purposes, grooming chutes will ONLY be permitted in the stall area. Grooming chutes will not be allowed in any walking area, aisles or outside of the Barns. Additional stall space is not allocated for chutes. Chutes must be placed in the stalls assigned to your entries. All grooming chutes will be issued an official identification tag, which must be displayed on the upper right corner of the grooming chute.

17. **Show Ring & Holding Areas:** All persons, except those exhibiting animals, will be excluded from the judging ring while judging is in progress. Steers must be under the control of the exhibitor at all times while in the judging arena. The ring stewards may render minimal assistance to exhibitors while in the judging arena; however, the show management reserves the right to disqualify any steer deemed uncontrollable or any steer, which requires more than one person to control it. No persons, except for the exhibitor and two representatives, (parent, sibling, FFA Instructor, 4-H Representative, or fellow 4-H/FFA Exhibitor), will be allowed in the designated holding area.
 18. **AOB:** All breeds listed in the book will have a breed show. If a breed has less than seven eligible steers represented, those steers will compete first on Wednesday, October 7, for the remaining JLA slots. At the conclusion of the last breed show with less than seven head, a special AOB class will determine the champion and reserve champion AOB that will return to compete for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion honors. The percentage of AOB steers in the sale will be based on the cumulative number of steers from breeds with less than seven head.
 19. **Selection of Junior Livestock Auction (JLA) Steers:**
 - a. For a breed champion to automatically qualify for the JLA there must be a minimum of seven head represented in the breed at the show.
 - b. If a breed has seven or more head represented, the number of head that will qualify for the JLA from that breed will be based on the percentage that breed makes up of the entire show.
 - c. Sale order for each breed will be held immediately following the selection of the breed champion and reserve breed champion for that breed. All exhibitors should be standing by in the holding area and ready for sale order at this time. Steers will be called into the judging arena for sale order until the required number of JLA sale slots and alternate slots have been filled. Exhibitors will be expected to promptly answer the call to the arena if their name is called.
 - d. The top 40 steers will qualify for the Junior Livestock Auction.
 - e. Only the Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, Breed Champions, and Reserve Breed Champions are required to sell. All other sale qualifying steers can be removed from the sale within 30 minutes after the sale order is finalized. The exhibitor must sign the official Sale Removal Form to remove a steer from the sale.
 20. **Junior JLA Meeting:** There will be a gathering for all Junior Market Steer exhibitors who are selected for the JLA on Wednesday, October 7, at the conclusion of the show in OFD Arena. At this time, steers will be clipped. Any and all instructions concerning the JLA will be given at this time.
 21. **JLA Steer Placement:** Steers must be tied in the designated area in the Oklahoma Ford Dealers Barn starting at 10 pm, Wednesday, October 7, until all the sale animals are loaded, Thursday, October 8.
 22. **Livestock Judging Contest Notice:** Please be aware when your animal is selected to participate in the Tulsa State Fair JLA, it has been committed to be used in the 4-H and FFA Livestock Judging Contest. A contest official will notify you if your animal will be used.
20. **Premiums:** 1st - \$50.00, 2nd - \$40.00, 3rd - \$35.00, 4th - \$30.00, 5th - \$25.00, 6th-10th - \$20.00.

STEER CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

DIVISION 82 — ANGUS

Live Animal Entry Requirements will be as follows:

1. Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred Angus.
2. Solid black. No white in front of navel, above the flank, or on leg, foot or tail.
3. Polled. No scurs or horns. No visible scaring from the removal of scurs or horns will be allowed.
4. Typical beef type confirmation. (No visible dairy influence)
6. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

DIVISION 83 — CHAROLAIS

Live animal entry requirements will be as follows:

1. Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a half blood or purebred Charoalis
2. White, yellow, gray, or silver in color. No black, red, dark smuts, excessive painting or spotting.
2. Typical beef type confirmation (No visible dairy influence)
3. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

DIVISION 84 — CHIANINA

Live animal entry requirements will be as follows:

1. Range in color from white to steel gray to black.
2. Black pigmented skin.
3. Typical beef type confirmation (No visible dairy influence)

3. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

DIVISION 85 — HEREFORD

Live Animal Entry Requirements will be as follows:

1. Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred Hereford.
3. Red body with white face, white underline, and white marked legs.
4. Traditional feather on crest.
5. Typical beef type confirmation. (No visible dairy influence)
6. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

The Oklahoma Hereford Association (OHA) will sponsor an added \$500 premium to the Tulsa State Fair Champion Hereford Steer and \$250 added premium to the Reserve Champion Hereford Steer provided they meet the following requirements:

- 1) The steer must be registered by the American Hereford Association (AHA) and out of a registered sire and dam. No steer certificate will be accepted, only the registration papers.
- 2) The steer must have a basic DNA test on file by the AHA.
- 3) At the time of check-in, exhibitors will be required to present the registration papers and a letter from the AHA stating their steer's basic test DNA profile is on file.

DIVISION 86 — LIMOUSIN

Live Animal Entry Requirements will be as follows:

1. Must show predominantly Limousin characteristics true to breed lines.
2. Solid black, red/orange, rich gold in color. No stocking legs, spotting above underline, brindle in mid-rib.
3. Typical beef type confirmation. (No visible dairy influence)
4. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

DIVISION 87 — MAINE-ANJOU

Live Animal Entry Requirements will be as follows:

1. Range in color from red, black, red and white, and black and white. No brindle or roan.
2. Typical beef type confirmation. (No visible dairy influence)
3. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

DIVISION 88 — SHORTHORN

Live Animal Entry Requirements will be as follows:

1. Must display Shorthorn color and characteristics.
2. Red, white, red and white roan.
2. Typical beef type confirmation. (No visible dairy influence)
3. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

DIVISION 89 — SIMMENTAL

Live Animal Entry Requirements will be as follows:

1. Must physically exhibit characteristics of a purebred Simmental.
2. Solid black, red, red and white, yellow and white, black and white in color. Some painting or spotting above the underline. Bald, blaze or streak face.
2. Typical beef type confirmation. (No visible dairy influence)
3. No hump or floppy ears; clean underline and no visible sheath (No visible Brahman influence)

DIVISION 90 — CROSSBRED

Any steer that does not satisfy the requirements of one of the above breeds will only have the option to be in the crossbred division.
