COUNTRY CREATIONS RULES & REGULATIONS

Washington County Fair Association

NOTICE: All exhibitors and participants are cautioned to read carefully the following rules and regulations as same will be strictly enforced without deviation of any kind.

The Washington County Fair Association reserves to its Executive Board the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Washington County Fair, and the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgement may determine. An exhibitor participant who violates any of the general, division, show or special rules as published in this catalog will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such.

Special rules or conditions are published in each division where necessary. If there is a conflict between any special rules or conditions of any division and the general rules and regulations, the special rules or conditions will prevail.

If any of the foregoing Rules or any provisions of any single Rule is later to be held legally invalid or otherwise unenforceable, all other Rules, and all other provisions and terms of any Rule containing a provision or term later held to be legally invalid or unenforceable, shall remain in full force and effect.

- 1. The Fair will officially open Friday, September 13, 2019** unless postponed by the Executive Board, which they hereby claim the right to do, either in part or whole, for cause whatsoever, for the general good of all concerned. The gates will open to visitors from 7:00 a.m. to 12 midnight.
- 2.** The Youth Department of the Washington County Fair Country Creations Division is open to any Washington County Youth in Kindergarten through Grade Twelve. Must live or attend school in Washington County.
- 3.** The Adult Department of the Washington County Fair Country Creations Division is open to residents of Washington County. The Golden Age Department is open to residents in Washington County 65 years of age or older. Anyone 65 may elect to exhibit in the Adult Department.
- 4.** A \$2.00 entry fee **PER EXHIBITOR** will be assessed and must be paid prior to entering any items for show.
- 5. Articles must be made by the exhibitor and completed since the last fair. Articles exhibited at a previous Fair cannot be entered. VIOLATIONS MAY CAUSE THE EXHIBITOR TO FORFEIT ALL RIGHTS TO SHOW IN THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.**
- 6.** Business cards will not be attached to any articles exhibited.
- 7.** Only clean and undamaged articles will be accepted for exhibition.
- 8.** Exhibits are due on the specified date and time as listed in the Schedule of Events. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
- 9.** Entry cards should be completed **PRIOR** to delivering articles to the Country Creations for exhibition.

10. All articles shall be numbered by tag and/or label attached to the articles before being received by the chairperson in charge of the respective departments.

11. Only one article in each class of each department may be entered unless otherwise specified. Miscellaneous articles shall be items other than those already listed in the department classifications.

12. The committee chairperson has the right to refuse any item.

13. The judges determine the ribbon worthiness of each item shown according to its own guidelines. The judge's critical analysis determines final placement.

14. Every effort will be made for the security of the exhibitors and others in attendance, but the Association will not be responsible for any articles broken, lost or stolen while on the grounds.

15. The Props committee makes the final decision regarding display of items, taking into consideration the safety and security of the exhibits.

16. All exhibited articles and/or premium money not picked up by 2:00 p.m. on the Sunday afternoon following the close of the fair **will be forfeited to the Washington County Fair.**

17. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained against the Washington County Fair Association or its officers or agents, Washington County, Texas, by or on behalf of any person, firm or corporations, or their agents or representatives, servants or employees, having license or privileges to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupy space thereon.

18. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be delivered to the management of the Washington County Fair Association immediately after the occasion for such protest. Protest will be accepted prior to judging or immediately at the conclusion of judging. Depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is complete.

19. Entry into Country Creations Division enables the exhibitor to apply for the Washington County Fair Scholarships which are given each year to selected High School Seniors.

20. NO EARLY REMOVAL OF ITEM.

21. ANY EXHIBITOR NOT ADHERING TO ANY RULE(S) OF THIS DIVISION MAY BE BANNED FROM THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.

Adult: Open to residents of Washington County.

Golden Age: Open to residents in Washington County 65 years of age or older. Anyone over age 65 may elect to exhibit as an Adult.

All ribbons will have the following premium values:

Blue - \$1.00 , Red - \$0.75, White - \$0.50.

Grand Champion - \$5.00, Reserve Champion - \$3.00.

After judging a specific department the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue ribbon item in each age group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blue ribbon item. In case of a tie, the judge determines the winner.

SPECIAL AWARDS - High Premium Exhibitor: After judging, the adult with the highest premium value will be awarded the Overall High Premium Adult/Golden Age Exhibitor and receive an additional prize.

Open to any Washington County Youth in Kindergarten thru 12th Grade.

Must live or attend school in Washington Count.

The Youth Department will be divided into three groups for judging these divisions. The three groups are Kindergarten - 3rd Grade; 4th - 8th Grade; and 9th - 12th Grade. School Art is a separate division, does not receive premium money and is grouped differently. Please refer to School Art for additional information on that division.

All ribbons will have the following premium values:

Blue - \$1.00, Red - \$0.75, White - \$0.50.

Grand Champion - \$5.00, Reserve Champion - \$3.00.

After judging a specific department, the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue ribbon item in each age group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blue ribbon item. In case of a tie, the judge determines the winner.

SPECIAL AWARDS - High Premium Exhibitor: After judging, the youth with the

highest premium value will be named the Overall High Premium Youth Exhibitor and be awarded a buckle.

- **Checks will be mailed on or around November 1st.**
- **Uniform pricing will be enforced. Items must be tagged and priced in .50 increments Example: .50, 1.50, 2.50, 3.50 etc. NOTE: no .25 cents or .75 cents are to be used starting in 2018.**
- Sign-up for hours after your items have been checked in.
- Although all precautions will be taken, the Washington Cty Fair Assn. will not be responsible for items lost or stolen.
