

Requirements of ABBA Approved Shows

In addition to the procedures and requirements outlined in the ABBA Approved Show Rules the following must be followed by ABBA Approved Shows.

1. ABBA Approved Shows must be held in a facility that is suitable to stall cattle with ample wash racks, a covered show arena, a seating area for spectators and a quality sound system.
2. ABBA Approved Shows must use the assigned judge, rules and classes provided by the ABBA Office.
3. The show staff should notify the ABBA Office within six months of the show of the date and time of the event so the information can be added to the ABBA Calendar of Events.
4. The show officials should notify the assigned judge at least three months prior to the show to arrange for their travel, accommodations, fees, etc.
5. The show should submit the official show reports to the ABBA Office **no later than one month following the show.** The reports should include a listing of every entry in each class along with their registration number, animal name and exhibitors name in addition to the placing of each animal placed. This applies to both animal classes and group classes (a completed show program with the requested information is suitable).
6. The host of the International & National Shows MUST provide two scales that have been calibrated by the State Department of Agriculture Officials. The show should provide tables and chairs in the weighing & measuring area.
7. Shows MUST maintain a two-year average of 40 head or more to remain as an ABBA Approved Show.
