After some discussion motion was made by Abts that we go on record as favoring circulation of petitions to provide for fair funds to come from taxation in case the pari-mutual racing is outlawed at the next election. Motion seconded by Guerber and carried. The secretary was instructed to write letter to Oregon Fairs Association, c/o H. G. Smith, Secretary, Tillamook, Oregon, to this effect.
