

FAIR BOARD MEETING,

TUESDAY NIGHT, AUGUST 11, 1931.

Members of the Board present: President Banks; First Vice-president Minton; Second vice-president Hesse; Treasurer Kraus and Secretary-Manager Moore. Others present were: Robt. Greer, C. W. Craft, Mrs. McKercher, Mrs. Vincent, Mrs. Warrens, Mr. Kuratli, Mr. Stevenson, Mrs. Morgan, Mr. Schultz, Mr. Adams, Mr. Evans, Mr. Lilly, Mr. Batchelder, Mr. Cyrus and Mr. Hornecker.

Secretary gave general discussion regarding the Fair; the twin contest, the rules of entry, and the dinner for the civic clubs of the County were also discussed. Mr. Evans, Mr. Adams, and Mr. Schultz reported themselves as favorable for a dinner at the Fair on Friday night.

General discussion was had regarding the sheep and goat divisions, Mr. Schulmerich reporting that another class known as the Romneys were becoming very prominent in the County. Moved by Minton, seconded by Kraus, that Romneys be inserted in the premium list. Motion carried. Mr. Schulmerich also reported that he was going to need a great deal more room this year.

Mr. Lilly suggested that another year the Fair be moved up one week in order not to interfere with the prune harvest.

Mr. Greer gave reasons why the poultry exhibits were small saying that the premiums offered were too small and that there should be a sweepstakes prize also. It was decided that the rabbits should be confined to the club work and that Mr. Greer take charge of the 4H Club work, too. It was also decided to have Mr. Stromquist as poultry judge again this year.

It was decided to ask Mrs. S. S. Montague, Route 5, Portland, to act as judge for the flower show.

It was moved by Minton, seconded by Kraus, that Mr. Bill Cyrus get the home economics judge. Motion carried.

It was decided to leave Mrs. Bentley's judge up to her to secure.

It was suggested by Mr. Cyrus that schedules be brought in to the manager in order to avoid confusion and for announcing purposes.

Mr. Schulmerich suggested that Mr. Tigard be asked about a judge for the milk goats.

Meeting adjourned.
