

Fair Grounds
August 4, 1952

The Fair Board met at 8:00 p.m. with all members present.

Motion was made seconded and carried to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

Members of the Hillsboro Grange were present to discuss building an eating concession. After discussion it was decided that space north of the office building would be suitable and that they would construct same from lumber available with the charge for concession to be worked out on a percentage basis.

Motion was made by Abts, seconded by Nyberg and passed that the following bills be allowed:

Motion was made by Nyberg and seconded by Abts and carried that \$1500.00 be transferred from the Fair Board Fund to the Fair Movers Fund to apply on the new construction of buildings.

After discussion the decision was that there would be no entry fee on stock and that ribbons would be awarded.

The decision on different breeds of cattle was that each breed exhibit one day, because of lack of space.

There being no further business the meeting stood adjourned.
