

FAIR BOARD MEETING,

WEDNESDAY NIGHT, AUGUST 5, 1931.

Officers present: Robert Banks, president; C. D. Minton, first vice-president; H. T. Hesse, second vice-president; O. B. Kraus, treasurer; and Ed. L. Moore, manager.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved. Moved by Minton, seconded by Hesse, that the manager be instructed to offer the Forest Grove band a contract for three days and three nights for 23 men at a price of \$360.00. Motion carried.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Hesse, that \$50.00 or less be appropriated for school bands provided there were but two, and not more than \$60.00 for three bands. Motion carried.

Moved by Minton, seconded by Hesse, that \$35.00 be appropriated for the rent of the colored lights owned by the Chamber of Commerce, and now installed at the Fair grounds. Motion carried.

It was also unanimously agreed that no purchases should be made for the Washington County Fair without a requisition, and that invitations be sent to the senators and representatives. It was also agreed that the accepting of entries outside of Washington County in the Livestock division be settled according to the rules of the Fair.

The installation of a public address system was discussed, and Vice-president Minton wished to have time to confer with the Standard Oil Company.

It was unanimously agreed that the manner of making entries be such as followed by other Fairs with the exception of that which has previously been handled through the County School Superintendent's office now to be made at the General Office.

Meeting adjourned.
