Tony Abts reported he had been in contact with the City of Hillsboro council relative to the lights from the ball park and he thought we would be able to arrange for the lights and that Harry Seabold had offered to donate the poles for the lights. It was agreed to proceed on this basis.

Joe VanDyke was present relative to the interests of the horsemen in the use of the track. The matter of placing sawdust on the track to aid the horsemen was discussed and it was decided by and between this group and the car racing interests it would not interfere and that this would be the solution for each group.

The matter of getting Allied Arts to hang banners and do some decorating, signs, etc.,- on the grounds as well as throughout the county was discussed and their price of \$400.00 was accepted.
