

June 25, 1947.

Washington County Fair Board met in the office at the Fair grounds with all members present.

Following the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting plans for this years Fair were discussed and the premium book was studied and changes made before going to the printer.

A motion was made by Mr. Guerber to allow both boys and girls 4-H requests for increases in premiums. Seconded by Mr. Abts and passed. Changes are as follows according to letter from Mr. Cox, Asst. county agent:

"Two divisions have been added under handicraft for articles exhibited in the advanced woodworking club, and articles exhibited in the advanced leathercraft. Suggested premiums are 1st, \$2; 2nd, \$1.50; 3rd, \$1; 4th, 75¢; 5th, 50¢; 6th 50¢; 7th 25¢. Total \$13 for 2 classes.

Change Farm Safety to read, Class I exhibit for 4-H safety members who have not entered high school. Farm Safety class II for members enrolled in High school. 1st, \$2; 2nd, \$1.50; 3rd, \$1; 4th 75¢; 5th, 50¢. For two classes--total \$11.50

Premium awards in 4 judging contests, Livestock, Poultry, Rabbit, Crops. 1st \$5, 2nd, \$4 3rd, \$3."

A letter was read by the manager giving minutes of meeting of Dairymen of county discussing a livestock show at the Fair. Following discussion a motion was made by Mr. Abts to pass budget of \$2100.00 for Dairy show premiums providing quarters can be provided for holding show this Fall during the Fair. Seconded by Mr. Guerber. Passed.

Manager reported securing Miss Yungen as superintendent of Home Economics department and that she has agreed to revise and change premium book bringing same up to date. Motion by Mr. Guerber to bring total of Home Economics department premium money to \$350.00 Seconded by Mr. Abts and passed.

Mr. Guerber moved a charge of 25¢ be placed on the gate at the Fair this Fall for a season ticket. Seconded by Mr. Abts. Passed.

Meeting adjourned.
