

March 29, 1944.

The Washington County Fair board met in the Commercial National Bank with all members present including the secretary, Mr. and Mrs. Gifford were present as well as J. B. Thomas.

Mr. Guerber moved the board members submit statement as to time put in in connection with Mexican laborers occupying Fair buildings and payment be allowed by board after which inquiry would be made regarding either the sponsoring committee or War Food administration re-inbursing the Fair board in some manner for this expense. Passed.

Motion made to appoint J. B. Thomas as Fair manager for coming year. Seconded and Passed. Salary to be discussed later.

Mr. Thomas, F.F. A. instructor, asked that a class for Fat Beef and one for Beef Breeding be added to the premium list, each to amount to a total of \$27.50 in prizes. Motion made to approve and passed.

Mr. and Mrs. Gifford who own the property south of the new piece of property recently acquired by the Fair Board, asked to have the alley between their piece and the Fair property vacated by the Board. Discussion held and Mr. Christensen and Mr. Thomas appointed to straighten same out.

Secretary instructed to write Mr. Hudson of the War Food Administration regarding the installing of new plumbing in Fair building, that the Board will furnish material for men's facilities in the south east corner of the Farmer Union building as outlined by Mr. Crafton of the W.F.A., if the W.F.A. will install and take care of all labor. Considering the unsanitary condition of the Fair grounds and buildings after they were occupied the past year the board does not feel obliged to stand all expense of this installation. For the same reason they have decided to not install any women's facilities at all until such time as the fair goes back to normal and is not used for other purposes than the Fair. Secretary also instructed to inquire regarding voucher returned to Mr. Hudson in February.
