

FAIR BOARD MEETING.

TUEASAY NIGHT, MARCH 3, 1936.

The Washington County Fair Board met with the representatives from the Granges of the County and the Farmers Union locals. President Hesse presided. All members of the Fair Board were present.

The president reported that the County Court had turned the Fair Board down on their request for funds. There would be the millage for premium money, and they would have the dog racing money, if there was any.

A general discussion followed in regard to holding a 1936 fair. All those present expressed themselves as desiring a fair, and as representatives of their organizations they had been instructed to say they would do their best with booths with booths.

After the delegates had left the Fair Board held a meeting. Moved by Minton, seconded by Banks, that warrants for \$15.00 be drawn for each of the members of the Fair Board for five meetings, which includes the meeting for to-night. Motion carried. Mr. Minton's check to include \$.40 for phone calls.

The secretary presented a bill for her services and office expenses in the amount of \$3.14. Motion made and carried that this amount be allowed and check drawn for the same.

After a lengthy discussion in regard to a fair for 1936 it was decided to see the County Court again.
