

May 15, 1956

The Fair Board met at the United States National Bank with all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. O'Neel, supervisor of the Hobby Hall was present and asked to have more cases for display in the hobby hall, asking especially for one tall one for a wood carving collection that she would be able to get if provisions were made for locking the display case, also she stressed the matter of getting more entertainment or she felt people were going to lose interest in the fair.

Mr. Ed. Day, public relations representative of the First National Bank was present with Earl Simantel and Alvin Haase in the interest of the Guernsey cattle people also the Washington County Swine Producers. They asked if they might not have identification cards to put on the people showing animals to designate the animal being shown, etc. They were assured they might have such tags or cards.

A plan was presented by the above people for a swine barn which would measure 80 x 24 feet and allow for addition of sheds on either side as funds are available and expansion is needed. Some estimates and figures were \$265.00 for galvanized material for the roof, and estimated a total of \$600.00 for the building. Said they could guarantee \$400.00 as contributions.

An okay was given to the above volunteers and the following motion made by Abts -- That the fair board will stand the expense of \$100.00 now and for the additional expense of construction the fair board agrees if and when the money is available, to take up the difference between the cost of the building and the amount that the swine producers are able to raise by subscription providing the difference does not exceed \$350.00. Motion seconded by Nyberg and passed.

The matter of location was discussed whereupon motion was made by Nyberg and seconded by Abts that the center line of the barn be the same as the existing open class barn and 50 feet east of the existing open class dairy barn. Motion carried.

A schedule for open class swine was presented by Alvin Haase as follows :

Recommendations for procedure for swine show at Co. fair

All applications for entries of swine must be accompanied by the name of the owner, name, recorded number and date of birth of each animal, and the names, numbers of the sires and dams of the animals entered.

No animal allowed in judging ring in single classes without a driver for each animal.

Exhibitors will not be limited as to number of entries but no one exhibitor will be allowed more than two ~~monies~~ *monies* in any one class and only two ribbons shall be given to that exhibitor in that class.
