

May 6, 1957

The Washington County Fair Board met for their regular monthly meeting in the U. S. National Bank building at 8:00 p.m., with all members present.

Representatives of the Hillsboro Jaycee's were present and the spokesman for the group, Don Cady, stated they were interested in seeing that the county was represented at the State Fair in Salem and the P.I., in Portland and that all the chapters in the county would be willing to cooperate to this extent. The fair board informed them they did not have any authority in the matter but would be willing to direct a letter to the county court recommending that that body appoint the Jaycees to install and man the booth and that they might receive the money offered by the State to the counties for putting on the displays. The Secretary was instructed to write such a letter to the county court.

Mr. Raymond Prater representing the Tualatin Valley Rabbit Breeder's was present asking if the board would buy some more coops for their coming show in May. A letter was read from their Secretary Susan Springer to the effect that their Club had voted to donate to the fair \$75.00 to apply on rabbit coops provided they purchase 100 coops.

Manager Ed Ball stated that Josephine County had some turkey coops which they wished to sell and that they might be reasonable and fill the needs. He was instructed by the board to look into the matter further and if they were suitable and reasonable in price that he might contract to purchase the same.

Mr. Paul Dutcher now employed by the Hillsboro Argus, but soon to open up an advertising office in Hillsboro was present and stated he would be interested in working as assistant manager during the time needed by the fair and that he felt he was qualified, experienced and was in a position to obtain entertainment for the fair. The matter was left open to be studied as to pay, and it was suggested to Mr. Dutcher that he submit to the board at the next meeting what he would consider proper.

Mrs. Noble Shearer, supervisor in Farm crops was present asking for some slight changes and additions, mainly that the county premium list might conform with the state premium list. These changes were granted upon motion made by Abts, seconded by Lindow and passed.

Mr. Lon Kinnaman Jr., of the Washington County Guernsey Club was present and the Dairy situation was discussed, namely that one pass would be issued for each 5 head and not more than 3 passes to any individual, and that the intentions of exhibitors to exhibit must be in the hands of the secretary by Aug. 10, 1957

The secretary was instructed to write the H-H Organization, Washington Grange, Kinton Grange and the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ that the space for eating concessions was going to be rearranged and ask that they attend a meeting at the fair grounds at 7:30 p.m., May 20th to discuss the situation.

Motion was made by Abts that we write the Horseshoe Pitchers Association that we are in need of that space occupied by them as we are rearranging the grounds. Motion seconded by Lindow and passed.

Motion made by Abts, seconded by Lindow and carried that the following bills be allowed:

There being no further business to come before the meeting the same stood adjourned.
