

minutes - Washington County Fair Board - October 7, 1970

The regular monthly meeting of the Washington County Fair Board was held in the fair office on October 7, 1970, with Chairman Jossy presiding. Those present were McGough, Adams, Ball and Shearer; guests Lloyd Mills, FFA instructor at Forest Grove.

Mr. Mills brought a rough draft of the FFA section for the 1971 premium book. Several rule changes have been made, divisions clarified and all sections brought up to date. They have taken the Better Farming exhibit and made it more clear and added \$12.00 additional premium money. Dr. McGough moved to allow this change. Mr.

Adams seconded Motion carried. Mr. Jossy asked if the FFA would be interested in setting up a landscaping division such as the one at the State Fair. Mr. Mills stated they have discussed this and would be willing if the rules are basically the same as State Fair and premium money \$25.00 - \$20.00 - \$15.00 - \$10.00 - \$5.00. Mr. Jossy will lay out rules and areas and Mr. Mills will take this information back to the other advisors for their approval. Having the FFA chapters start bedding plants to be used on the grounds was discussed. Mr. Mills felt this would be agreeable with the chapters. An increase in the Ag-Mechanics display will be worked on. Mr. Mills and Mr. Ball will work out the plans for additional shelf space and new booth construction for the FFA on Parade. There was some misunderstanding about the sponsorship of the Stock Judging Contest and the Fair Board paid for the banners this year. Mr. Mills was encouraged to find a sponsor for this contest. The Board thanked Mr. Mills for attending the meeting.

The building program discussed at the special meeting has been turned over to Bud Kay for prices on the bleachers and barns. Mr. Kay was unable to attend the meeting but had sent prices on the barn. He was unable to obtain prices for the bleachers on such short notice but will get this information to Mr. Jossy as soon as possible. The barn prices would be \$25.20 a running foot 28 ft wide; \$19.20 a running foot 24 ft. wide. No decision was made on starting this until Mr. Adams meets with the 4-H leaders association to get their feelings about moving the 4-H horse show back into the fair. It was agreed this barn is needed for 4-H.

Mr. Adams moved the minutes be approved as filed. Dr. McGough seconded. Motion carried.
