

September 16, 1950

Washington County Fair Board met in the office of the manager with all members present including Joe Cox, assistant county agent.

The meeting was held for the purpose of discussing the Grange booths who failed to qualify for premium money at the fair. The three judges who worked on judging the grange booths agreed the quality of crops used in the booths failing to qualify for the money as it was not up to standard raised in those communities. After much discussion it was moved by Mr. Guerber and seconded by Mr. Abts to invite the chairmen of the booth committees of Hillsboro Grange, Dixie Mountain Grange and Aloha grange into discuss the booth ~~xxx~~ judging and at that time to pay them \$25.00 each for their efforts in putting in the booths.

Mr. Abts moved that correction be made in 4-H livestock and crop division, P.59 of the premium book authorizing secretary to pay two classes, Brown Swiss and other breeds, as per minutes of June 22nd, 1950. Passed.

Motion made that following explanation made by Mr. Cox relative to Lot 16, Bee Culture check be written to Washington County 4-H Bee Club for sum of \$10 allowed. Moved by Mr. Guerber and seconded by Mr. Abts.

F.F.O. bill for 1200 judging tags amounting to \$6.70 presented by Mr. Thomas. Mr. Guerber moved we allow this bill, seconded by Mr. Abts and passed.
