

The Washington County Fair Board met Thursday evening, September 21st, 1939 in the Chamber of Commerce rooms with R.G. Scott and Harry Schmeltzer present as well as manager Leon S. Davis and Mrs. Davis.

J. Rushlow, local agent of the Westchester Insurance company and Mr. Larson their state representative, Mr. Walker of the Oregon Mutual Insurance company and a representative of the Home insurance company were present, to discuss settlement of the insurance following the burning of the stock barn at the fair ground Sept. 7, 1939. Also the damage to the hog barns and other buildings was discussed.

Mr. Walker brought his papers for signing preparatory to a final settlement of the insurance held in their company for the fair building burned. The representative of the Home Insurance company signified her intention of settling at once. Mr. Larson argued that their policy was not as represented by their agent, said agent having declared the policy to be a blanket policy and therefore covering all buildings but Mr. Larson was not inclined to back him up. They left without giving any definite answer as to whether they considered they had any liability in the matter.

It was moved by Mr. Scott and seconded by Mr. Schmeltzer to have the manager secure an appraisal of the Fair buildings at once. Passed.

Mr. Torvend was present with plans for a new barn to replace the one burned. The plans were secured from State college.
