

Fairgrounds
Sept. 5, 1962

The meeting was called to order by President Lindow at 8:10 P.M.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

The Theme Contest entries were discussed. Firstplace - Miss Adeline Wallender, Rt. 2, Box 266, Hillsboro - "Washington County on Parade".
Second place - Eila Marsh, P. O. Box 103, Hillsboro, Oregon - "Washington County Fair-arama".

During the fair there was much discussion about having either pari-muteal racing or a rodeo during the fair next year. Since Mr. Simantel was unable to attend the meeting no definite plans were made but the board felt we should find out more details as to what is involved. Since the Tillamook County Fair has had racing, the Secretary was ordered to write and get some information from them. The area was discussed and it was agreed the best place would be where the Kartway track is.

Mr. Lindow reported on the Polk County Fair which he attended on Sunday. They have a lovely Garden and Farm Crops building which was put up for the cost of 50¢ a square foot. Also, they have 8 - 10 service clubs and granges that have concession stands. The board felt this would be a very fine idea to get the service clubs of this county to do the same thing.

Some tentative plans were made for the 1963 Fair. Wrestling would be Tuesday and Thursday, Style Show Wednesday.

Mr. Danielson would like to put on a professional Syle show in relationship to mink furs; Mr. Lindow asked that he find out more details as to what this would involve and the ~~max~~ costs.

Mr. Johnson made a motion that the dairy cattle, swine, and poultry classes premiums be doubled on open class and also livestock classes in L-H be doubled. Mr. Danielson seconded, Motion carried.

Mr. Johnson made a motion to add "Other Breeds" in Dairy, Swine, and Chicken division. Mr. Danielson seconded.

Mr. Lindow made a motion that a large head ~~fxn~~ of dairy cattle be invited

from an outside county to exhibit during the fair to increase interest. Mr. Johnson seconded. Motion carried.

There seems to be more interest in Rabbits and if some group would meet with the board a Rabbit Division could possibly be added.
