Section 7-4 (Showmanship)

- Poultry Showmanship Rules:
- All entries must be made by a currently enrolled 4-H member
 - Bird used in showmanship must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor
 - Exhibitors will be judged on their ability to handle and examine poultry, the exhibitor's knowledge of poultry, appearance and actions. Knowledge tested will be age appropriate and consists of questions related to breeds, classes and standard care and management of poultry.

- All animal entries are subject to the West End Fair Association health guidelines and requirements. See the fair premium book for complete requirements.
- Project animals must be barrows or gilts.
- Members will be allowed to show one animal per class.
- For complete project rules and requirements, members may contact their club leader or the extension office.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR SWINE

No swine showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease will be admitted to any show.
 All show swine must be individually identified by either ear tag, ear notch, or tattoo.
 An official health certificate (AAI-13), signed by an accredited veterinarian, must accompany all swine. It must state that the animal(s) show no signs of contagious or infectious diseases. The certificate must be issued within 30 days of the opening date of the show and list all animals

Section 10 - Vegetables

- In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest; select medium size specimens. If at all possible, do not mix varieties.
- The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge:
 - Trueness to variety type. If at all possible, pick the specimens from one variety.
 - Uniformity in shape, size, and color.
 - Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, then select the others as similar to it as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity.
 - Protect from dirt, disease, infection, and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
 - Condition and maturity. Be sure that exhibits are of high quality.
 - Potatoes should not be washed. Remove soil using a soft cloth or brush.
 - Tomatoes should have stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed from vegetables leaving about (2) two inches of stems.
- Read premium material, carefully following all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for five specimens, be sure to exhibit that number; do not enter four or six. In any instance, your exhibits will be disqualified if the correct number of specimens is not entered.
 - Project I - Maximum 6 entries in this section, plus entry 45, 46, 47
 - Project II - Maximum 10 entries in this section, plus entry 45, 46, 47
 - Project III - Maximum 15 entries in this section, plus entry 45, 46, 47 (Project III is highest level - may be repeated until end of 4-H involvement)
