Exhibitors must check in at the Fair office located in the entry way at the Event Center before entries can be made. Entries in all divisions will be made under the Persons Name.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE

This Tabloid, including the Premium List, for Woodward County Free Fair is being issued, with the distinct understanding that if for any reason whatsoever sufficient funds are not available to pay in full premiums and awards as listed, the Woodward County Free Fair Board reserves the right to prorate premiums on a percentage basis. The attention of all exhibitors is especially called to this condition and provision, and exhibits are accepted only with this understanding. It is the purpose of the Board of Directors to do everything that is possible to make this Free Fair a success and to add to the comfort, pleasure and convenience of the visitors and exhibitors who attend. Our fairs in the past were successes and with the past experience we hope to be able to serve the people who contribute to much better advantage this year.

The Free Fair Association earnestly solicits your support and your cooperation in making this Fair a success, as no other factor does more to stimulate and improve farm conditions than Agriculture Fairs, here one may observe the improvements of farm crops and animals and compare them with their own.

The management appeals to you to lend your support by bringing exhibits, boosting and attending the Fair. It is upon your support that we depend for a successful Fair.

## FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read these rules carefully. Do not ask the management to vary from them.

Your exhibit is accepted with the understanding that you are familiar with the provisions of this tabloid. Bulletin Boards will be maintained during the Fair at the Secretary's office, and at the livestock headquarters, on which any changes of program or special announcements will be posted from day to day.

### RULE 1: Interpretation, violations, etc.

**Section 1:** The Board of Directors reserves the right to interpret these rules and to settle all questions arising in connection with the Woodward County Free Fair.

**Section 2:** Any person who violates any of the rules and provisions of the catalog will, by so doing, forfeit all rights, privileges, awards and premiums offered.

### RULE 2: Entry Requirements.

**Section 1:** Exhibits may only be entered during the time printed in the Schedule of events.

**Section 2: ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE BY THE ENTRY DEADLINE TIME FOR THEIR DEPARTMENT AND REMAIN IN PLACE UNTIL THE CLOSE OF THE FAIR THE LAST DAY OF THE FAIR.**

**Section 3:** All exhibits of grain, seed, forage, fruits and vegetable to compete for prizes must have been grown by the exhibitor in Woodward County during the CURRENT crop year.

**Section 4:** All property entered at the Fair for any purpose shall be subject to the control of the management of the Fair or the Superintendent in charge.

**Section 5:** Separate exhibits must be provided for each entry except livestock herd exhibits. Only one entry will be allowed under any one Lot number except in the livestock department.

**Section 6:** No exhibit will be entered that were exhibited at a past County Fair, except in the Livestock Department.

**Section 7:** Any person that lives in Woodward County, pays taxes into the general fund of Woodward County or a member of the immediate family of a taxpayer may exhibit at the Fair.

### Rule 3: Duties and Privileges

**Section 1:** The Superintendent of each division in the livestock department shall have full authority to move or arrange exhibits when, in his judgment, it becomes necessary. Exhibitors will be expected to keep their spaces or stalls in a clean, sanitary condition at all times during the Fair.

**Section 2:** Any member of the Board of Directors of the Free Fair Association shall have access to all premises of any character on the Fairgrounds at any time during the Fair.

**Section 3:** The Decision of the judges shall be final and no appeal will be considered except in case of protest.

### Rule 4: Protests and Appeals

**Section 1:** All protests shall be made to the Secretary in writing within four hours after the decision is made and shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$5.00, which shall be forfeited in case the protest is not sustained. All protests must state plainly the cause of the complaint.

**Section 2:** In addition to the right of protest herein guaranteed the exhibitors, the Board of Directors reserve the right to take cognizance of fraud, or any attempt there at, in connection with any exhibit, display or commercial display and shall take such action as they deem just and proper.

### Rule 5: Power and Liabilities of the Association

**Section 1:** The management will use every precaution to guard against fraud or extortion in any form on the Fairgrounds.

**Section 2:** The Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, display, concession or show that may have been falsely entered, or that may be deemed objectionable or to remove any sign, banner,

identification or signature, or advertising matter of any kind which may be deemed objectionable to them, without giving any reason therefore.

**Section 3:** No diseased or sick animal will be permitted to be exhibited or occupy any stall at the Fair, and every precaution will be taken to enforce this rule, but the management will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may be sustained through violation of the rule.

**Section 4:** No claim for injury to any person or property in any way whatsoever shall be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained against the Woodward County Free Fair Association, its officers, directors, or agents, on behalf of any person, firm or corporation. If property owner, or others interested in property on the Fairgrounds, desire protection against loss, damage or injury from fire or other cause, they must make their own arrangements therefore.

### Rule 6: Premiums and Awards

**Section 1:** NO PREMIUMS WILL BE AWARDED ON ARTICLES NOT LISTED IN THIS TABLOID. ARTICLES NOT LISTED MAY BE ACCEPTED FOR DISPLAY ONLY!!!

**Section 2:** Where there is no competition, the judge shall award first, second or third premium according to the merits of the exhibit.

**Section 3: ALL PREMIUMS WILL BE MAILED OUT TO EXHIBITOR AT ADDRESS GIVEN AT TIME OF REGISTRATION.**

**Section 4:** Special awards may be given in each of the open Class Departments.

### OPEN CLASS DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Exhibitors failing to have their exhibits in place at the time specified will be barred from competing for premiums except as otherwise provided.
2. **ENTRIES MUST BE MADE AT TIME LISTED ON SCHEDULE ON FIRST DAY OF FAIR, IN ALL DEPARTMENTS EXCEPT LIVESTOCK.**
3. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and made since the last fair.
4. If it be ascertained that any exhibitor has made a false statement or entry in regards to any article exhibited, all premiums awarded such person shall be forfeited.
5. Soiled article or articles may not be allowed to be entered at the discretion of the department superintendent or the Board of Directors.
6. **ARTICLES SHALL NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL MONDAY AFTER SHOW, EARLY REMOVAL COULD RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF ANY PRIZE MONEY. (EXCLUDES SHOW ANIMALS)**
7. Not more than one entry will be permitted for any Lot by the exhibitor. A separate exhibit is required for each Lot except in the Livestock department.
8. Exhibitors must not change their exhibit or any part thereof after the hour designated for the exhibit to be in place.

County Winners (excluding machine class) will receive awards from Oklahoma Wheat Commission.

Recipes winning first place at the previous State Contest are ineligible to compete.

Each entry must be prepared and baked by the person whose name is on the entry form.

The same person may not win Champion, Reserve Champion or Bread Machine Class. Two separate people should win, unless entries do not offer that selection.

Recipe must accompany entry at county and state level. Entries that are eligible to compete at state level will provide 2 recipes - one at county fair (which will be mailed to Commission office by county Home Economist) and bring one with entry at state competition.

Whole Grain Bread Class #2 - This category will include only the use of whole wheat flour and/or a whole white wheat flour. NO All purpose flour or Bread Flour included in this category. Dough enhancers, vital wheat gluten and whole grains, in addition to whole wheat, are permissible.

Dinner rolls should consist of three (3) rolls per entry. Any shape acceptable.

Specialty Shapes Class #11 - Let your imagination go: animals, people, objects, etc. All garnishes must be edible.

The other Wheat Breads, Class #'s 4 and 9 will include other breads made with yeast such as cheese, French, onion, sourdough, challah, etc. NO QUICK BREADS unless yeast is used as a leavening agent. (Breads must use yeast as a leavening agent.) "Best of Wheat", sponsored Bread Baking Contest is to be judged separately from county fair open class division

County Champion and Reserve Champion from each division are eligible for state competition (see exception below) at the State Fair of Oklahoma.

One Bread Machine entry from each division class #'s competition at state level. Bread machine entries will not be eligible for County Champion or Reserve Champion at county level or eligible for Grand Champion at State level.

Social Security number is mandatory for state competition.

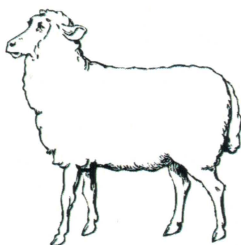

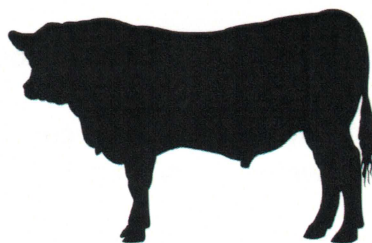

4-H and FFA exhibitors must be actively enrolled and in good standings of a Woodward County 4-H Club or respective Woodward County School District FFA Chapter.

**Dress Code** - All exhibitors must wear western attire; jeans, boots, and a long sleeved collared shirt. Western hat is optional.

Showmanship divisions will be determined by the exhibitors age the day of the show.

All of the rules governing the horse show department as well as the general rules and regulations will apply to this department. Any questions that may arise not covered by these rules will be decided by the horse superintendents and their decision will be final.

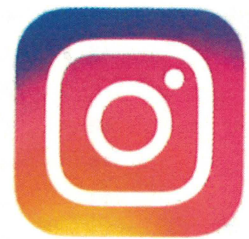
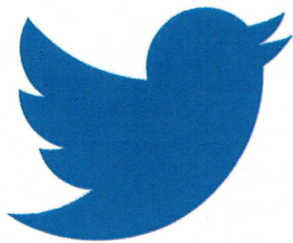
