General Rules & Guidelines

- State Rules are available in Fair Office or online at www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe.
- Unless otherwise designated, all open departments' exhibits are limited to residents of Colusa, Solano, Sutter, Yuba and Yolo Counties.
- All Adult Departments are for Exhibitors 18 Years & up.
- Absolutely no entries will be accepted after closing dates.
- There will be no refund of fees regardless of circumstances.
- Entry Fees can be paid by Cashier's Check, Money Order or Check and must be received by the Closing of Entries or your entry will not count.
- If the entry fee is refused by the bank, a penalty of \$35.00 per transaction must be paid before the judging of the entry.
- Upon submittal of entry. Exhibitors and their agents, parents, leaders acknowledge that:
 - They understand the State Rules and the local fair rules;
 - They agree to abide by them;
 - They certify that all information on the form is true and correct;
 - They agree to comply with the fair's decision regarding any violation of the rules, and
 - In the case of established unethical treatment of animals or violation of drug policy rules, exhibitor's name will be forwarded to Fairs and Expositions.
- Yolo County Fair Management reserves the right to screen, reject entirely, or accept conditionally, any exhibit that, in management's opinion, may be in questionable taste for the general fair and attending public.
- All Items are judged using the American System of Judging, unless Danish System is stated prior to Division.
- At the Yolo County Fair, we do not pay Premiums per class unless directly stated in the Manual, instead we pay a Best Over All per division and in some cases, it is Just a Most Outstanding Rosette. For actual Premiums or Awards please refer to the individual Departments & Divisions.
- Unless Otherwise stated the Junior Departments Best Over All Awards are 1st - \$5.00, 2nd - \$4.00 & 3rd - \$3.00.

- Unless Otherwise Stated the Adult Departments Best Over All Awards will be 1st - \$15.00, 2nd - \$10.00 & 3rd - \$5.00.
- Sweepstakes Awards will be awarded in the Following Adult Departments and will have award monies of \$25.00 for 1st, \$20.00 for 2nd & \$15.00 for 3rd:
 - Agriculture Horticulture
 - Cut Flowers
 - Baked Goods
 - Preserved Foods
 - Clothing & Textiles
 - Potted Plants
- All ribbons (except for those given at the time of judging) will be given out when entries are released.
- For the protection of exhibitors, No Entries will be removed on the Closing Night of the Fair.
- Premiums (cash awards) are paid only in accordance with results recorded into the online program. Tags, ribbons, etc. have no value as to payment of premiums.
- Premiums or Awards will be available in the buildings on the Exhibit Release Date & for the next 3 weeks in the fair office during normal business hours. After 30 days from check issue date, all unclaimed premium or award monies will become forfeit and will return to being Yolo County Fair Property.
- Premium Checks Must be Cashed within 30 Days. No Checks will be reissued & after the 30 days all premiums revert to the Yolo County Fair.
- The Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at the Fair. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the program or event. This included any injury to others or to the exhibitor or to the exhibitor's property.
- Proper precautions will be taken for the protection of the exhibits, but Yolo County Fair or its representatives will not be responsible for loss by fire, theft or otherwise.
- The Exhibitor agrees to indemnify and save harmless Association and the State of California, their officers, servants and employees from any and all claims, resulting from any damages, injury or loss to any person or persons, including all persons to whom the Exhibitor may be liable under any Worker's Compensation law and Exhibitor himself and from any loss, damage, cause of action, claims or suits

for damages including, but not limited to, loss of property, goods, caused by, arising out of or in any way connected with the exercise by Exhibitor of the privileges herein granted.

Traveling East on interstate 80: Interstate 80 E to the Woodland off ramp (Hwy 113) Take Gibson Road Exit 36. Turn left onto Gibson Road. At Matmor Road Signal Turn Right. Go to Gum Ave. Light and Turn left. Proceed West to Fairgrounds Main Entrance.

Traveling North on Interstate 5: Take I-5 North and Take the First Woodland Off Ramp Exit 537 and Turn Left. Follow East Main Street through town. Turn Left at East Street. Continue to East Street until Gum Ave. Light and go Left. Proceed East to the Main Entrance of the Fairgrounds.

Traveling South on Interstate 5: Take I-5 South to the Hwy 113 Exit 537. Stay on Hwy 113 to the Gibson Road Exit and go Right on this Off Ramp and take First Right onto Matmor Road. professional photographer will take place on Saturday at noon. We encourage and appreciate donations of art works or cash to the Benefit Auction which benefits Yolo County High School Art Departments.

Open to residents of Colusa, Solano, Sutter, Yuba and Yolo Counties.

Minimum age 18 years.

All entries must be labeled on reverse side with the name, address, and phone number of exhibitor and department, division & class name.

All exhibits must be "an original" work of the exhibitor and completed within the last year: class assignments done under supervision are not eligible for judging and should not be entered. Copies of all or significant parts of reproductions of artworks or photos not taken by the artist are not "original" and violate the copyright laws: do not enter them.

Second generation work, such as laser, photocopy, photographic lithograph, etc. Must be entered in Graphic or Print Class.

We Accept only those Paintings & Drawings that are framed & wired securely for hanging. No clamp-type framing with glass or acrylic edges exposed and no Saw Tooth Hangers. Gallery wrapped canvases that are wired for hanging are acceptable.

The Management reserves the right to reject any entries in this department.

No painting & drawing shall exceed 40 x 40 Inches, including frame.

Greatest care will be taken in handling, but no responsibility for loss or damage will be assumed by the Painting or Drawing Department of the Yolo County Fair or its agents. All insurance must be carried by the exhibitor.

All sales will be referred to the exhibitor.

For the protection of exhibitors, no entries will be removed on the closing night of the fair.

Regular Classes:

Mini Pies in A Cupcake Tin – Bring 6 on Paper Plate

Ingredients –

2 (2-Count) Packages Refrigerated Pie Crusts

4 Cups Pie Filling – Any Flavor

1 Egg – Whisked

Steps -

Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease 12 muffin cups with cooking spray.

Roll out a single pie crust onto a flat surface. Using a large cookie cutter or any circular lid, cut out a 4-inch circle of dough. Press each dough circle into the bottom of a muffin tin cup, leaving a tiny rim of dough sticking out at the top. Repeat with remaining dough to fill all 12 muffin cups.

Fill each cup until nearly full, about 1/4 cup, with pie filling.

Use the remaining dough to create a top crust to cover each pie. To make a lattice crust, use a knife or pizza cutter to cut out thin strips of dough, then lace together to form a lattice. To make a standard crust, cut out a circle of dough just large enough to cover the top of the bottom crust. Cut a few small slits into the crust. Then using your fingers, gently press the

top crust onto the bottom crust until they stick together, and no gaps remain.

Use a pastry brush to brush the tops of each pie with the whisked egg. Then bake 30 to 40 minutes, or until the crust is lightly golden and the filling begins to bubble.

Remove from the oven and let cool for at least 15 minutes. Then very carefully with a knife, loosen the edges of each pie and gently lift out from the muffin tin. Serve immediately or cover and refrigerate.

Thumbprints – Bring 6 on a Paper Plate

Ingredients

6 tablespoons butter, softened

1/2 cup sugar

1 large egg

2 tablespoons canola oil

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/4 teaspoon butter flavoring

1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1/4 cup cornstarch

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

3 tablespoons apricot or other fruit preserves

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy; beat in egg, oil, vanilla and butter flavoring. In another bowl, whisk together flour, cornstarch, baking powder and salt; gradually beat into creamed mixture.

Shape dough into 1-in. balls; place 2 in. apart on greased baking sheets. Press a deep indentation in center of each with the end of a

wooden spoon handle. Bake until edges are light brown, 8-10 minutes.
