

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show.h addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested (by the approved laboratory to which it is sent) is the one taken from the animal in question. Its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

SIGNATURES REQUIRED ON THE BACK OF THIS FORM!

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. h the furtherance of

their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the AFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

OSCEOLA COUNTY FAIR & LIVESTOCK SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITION

- 1. The Osceola County Fair & Livestock Show does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or misdirected forms, entries or articles of exhibit.
- 2. All rules are subject to the interpretation of the Board of Directors of the Fair. All decisions made by the Board are final. This Board reserves the right to deny or allow any entry to the Fair and Fairgrounds.
- 3. All non-commercial exhibits must check in according to committee guidelines as published. No exhibit may leave the grounds prior to the scheduled release dates & times as indicated in the various calendars and/or individual department or section rules.
- 4. In all events and exhibits being judged, the judge's decision shall be final.
- 5. All entries, if not claimed by close of check out time shall become the property of the Fair. All premiums will be paid and checks mailed within 6 weeks after the fair ends. Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of the issue date.
- 6. A \$30.00 fee or 5% of the face amount will be charged for any bad check received by the Fair for entries, animal sales, sponsorships, contracts, etc.
- 7. Any formal complaints shall be presented in writing within six (6) hours of the discrepancy to the Fair Office to be handled as they see fit.
- 8. Any exhibitor or vendor conducting or participating in any illegal or immoral activities on the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to display at the Fair and will lose any monies owed or paid by/to the Fair for premiums, sales, privilege agreements, etc.
- 9. If these rules contradict any committee rule(s) the committee rule(s) shall prevail.
- 10. By signing any privilege agreement, license, entry form, etc., participant agrees to release and discharge the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc. and the Board of Directors & staff thereof from all liabilities, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature that may arise from or be connected with the participant's participation in any activity sponsored by Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc.

To 4-H/FFA Exhibitors, Open Show Exhibitors and Parents/Guardians for the 2021 Fair:

IMPORTANT: All exhibitors MUST HAVE BEEN ACTIVE member in good standing the prior year (as defined by the governing associations guidelines) IN THE 2020-2021 4-H OR FFA PROGRAMS... and must be verified <u>as an active member according to the YOUTH MARKET ANIMAL RULE # 1.</u> Please read the Market Hog Show & Sale Rules.

COMPLETE forms Online between August 1st and 14th at 12:00 midnight. **YOU MUST RECIEVE A CONFIRMATION RECEIPT VIA EMAIL WHEN USING THE ONLINE SYSTEM.**

If a draw is needed it will be held on the first Thursday after registration closes at the fair office.

GENERAL RULES:

- 1. The Market Hog Show and Sale will be limited to one hundred thirty (130) hogs. Application forms are due on the required deadline date. The draw will be held the following Thursday.
- 2. Applicants will be divided into two (2) groups as follows:
 - 1. <u>GROUP A:</u> Exhibitors or clubs that exhibited an animal in the last year's Market Hog Show and Sale.
 - <u>GROUP B:</u> All others qualified to participate, as defined in the KVLS General Market Animal Rules. If necessary, Group B applications will be numbered. The corresponding number will be placed in a hat and numbers will be drawn until the total number of hog exhibitors is 130

ELIGILBILITY:

- 1. Only active Osceola County 4-H or FFA members are invited to participate; and must be residents of Osceola County and currently enrolled in school.
 - a. Anyone having graduated from high school, or currently dropped out of school, shall be ineligible to enter, show, or sell their market animals. All entrants must be active in the 4-H or FFA Programs, and meet all their requirements.
 - b. The child must be an Osceola County resident OR lives/resides on land in a bordering county, which the property continues, into Osceola County, may participate in the market animal programs provided they abide by all other rules and regulations.

<u>Minimum Exhibitor Age is 8 years old</u> (Ages are prior to September 1st of current 4-H/FFA Year)

• (New Rule) All Exhibitors are required to complete Ethic Class. If you need to sign up for the class go to https://floridastatefairag.com/.

Age Divisions:

Junior: 8-10 | Intermediate: 11-13 | Senior: 14-18

- 2. If your animal does not make weight, or if you do not meet any of the requirements of the market animal department, you are ineligible to compete in the Showmanship, Fitting & Grooming competition and premier exhibitor with the market animal exhibitors. You will be able to compete in the open animal Showmanship and Fitting & Grooming provided they are offered.
- 3. Any exhibitor conducting or participating in any illegal, illicit, or thug-based activities on or around the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to show and/or sell at the Fair. Any monies owed by the Fair for sales, premiums, and awards will be withheld at KVLS and the Committees discretion.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL MARKET ANIMAL EXHIBITORS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Minimum of 2.0 GPA (Grade Point Average) for the first semester (verified by submitting report card) or minimum of 70 on the Skill-a-thon.
 - a. Report Card to be turned in during the Skill-a-thon. to be used only for the exhibitor it was issued to. Any exhibitor abusing this will have the privilege taken away.

RECORD BOOKS:

- Record books must be completed and turned in if the animal is to be shown at the fair.
- Record Books will be graded from 1-100+ points. Exhibitors must have a minimum of 70 points **OR** pass to be able to show his/her animal. The Record Book must be kept in the exhibitor's own handwriting (no typewritten pages).
- \circ The only exception to this is the auctioneer's statement, which must be typed.
- Awards will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place BLUE RIBBON record books.
- At the time of official record book turn-in the exhibitor must declare if the record book enters the competition or pass/fail category. No matter the decision the books must pass in order to show.

SCHOLARSHIP:

- Exhibitor Scholarship rules and application forms may be obtained online.
- You must be age 14 by September 1st of current 4-H/FFA Year.
- Completed application forms are due the same time Record Books are due.
- See Event Calendar for complete details.

An additional entry will be placed for each year the applicant has participated in the draw without being drawn for a maximum of the three (3) previous years

ELIGIBILITY OF ANIMAL:

- Is limited to market barrow or open gilt (boars and stags will not be permitted). There will be a mandatory exhibitor meeting pre-initial weigh in; (Please see Events Calendar for dates and times).
- 2. THE EXHIBITOR MUST ATTEND THIS MEETING. IF IT IS NOT ATTENDED, THE EXHIBITOR WILL FORFEIT THEIR SPOT. IF YOU HAVE A PROBLEM ATTENDING, PLEASE CONTACT THE HOG CHAIRPERSON PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE MEETING.
- 3. All hogs must be ear tagged at the official ear tagging date. Weigh-in of hogs is optional. We recommend that hogs do not weigh over 100 pounds on the ear tagging date. If your animal is injured at the weigh-in, notify the chairman BEFORE you leave the premises.
- 4. Premise I.D tag must be installed at final weight in or pig may not come off the trailer.

All animals must be considered for sale and considered terminal projects.

- 5. Spare pig is 1 per exhibitor or 1 to be shared with immediate family. (FEDERAL TAX CODE). Each spare must have each exhibitor designated with it recorded at first weigh in or registration. Final selection must be made in the record book at time of record book turn in. Deadline for replacing injured hogs is the first Saturday of November. If your hog is injured, please contact committee.
- 6. A parent or legal guardian is required to be with the Exhibitors and responsible for unloading of any animals at Final Weigh-IN. Each exhibitor will have seven (7) minutes per animal for unloading. If an exhibitor takes more than seven (7) minutes, the exhibitor will be required to re-set their to the end of the line for another attempt. This will provide for a more expedited move in process and mitigate stress of animals in confined spaces.
- 7. Minimum weight at final weigh-in is 230 pounds. If your hog does not make weight for two consecutive years, you will lose your slot and must go back into the draw. There is no maximum weight; however, the exhibitor will not be paid for any weight over 310 pounds.
 - a. Market hogs **DO NOT** require health papers, but must be checked by the State Inspector at the gate upon entering the fairgrounds. If you do not make weight, your hog will not be auctioned off. Exhibitor or their agent must be present for the weigh-in. If your hog is to be shown in the Youth Swine Show, please contact Youth Swine Chairperson.
 - b. Hogs will be weighed on certified scales and this will be the official weight. Hogs will only have one opportunity to be re-weighed. This will consist of removing the hog from the scales, setting scales to zero and immediately reweighing. Hogs will not be permitted to leave the weigh-in pen area prior to being re-weighed. No food or water in scale area.
- 8. A MANDATORY MEETING WILL BE HELD ON THURSDAY, AFTER FINAL WEIGH-IN at 4:00 PM. See event calendar for time. Hogs will be placed in classes based on final

weight. The management reserves the right to determine the number of and size of classes to ensure maximum efficiency in conducting the show. All pens are assigned.

- 9. All animals must be fed, cared for and their beds cleaned by the exhibitor for the entire time they are on the Fairgrounds. If this is not done, a \$50 fine will be deducted from the sale of your animal.
- 10. All hogs must be trained for show and controlled by the exhibitor. Animals that cannot be handled properly by the exhibitor will be disqualified.
- **11.** All animals will be bedded in sawdust. **ALL HOGS MUST COME IN CLEAN. DUE TO STATE AGRICULTURE REGULATIONS, ALL TRAILERS MUST BE CLEAN AND SANITIZED. THE INSPECTOR MAY REFUSE ENTRY OF ANIMAL.**

SHOWMANSHIP:

1. A separate competition will be held check Calendar for date of Showmanship. There will be a Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship class.

Section 6 | Showmanship

- 01. Junior Showmanship
- 02. Intermediate Showmanship
- 03. Senior Showmanship
- 2. Complete Skill-a-thon. See event calendar for Skill-a-thon date and time.
 - b. Incentive: All exhibitors that have at least 3.5 GPA for the first semester (not weighted or cumulative) or scores at least 95 on Skill-a-thon will receive one (1) Funcard. Any exhibitor that achieves both the 3.5 GPA and scores at least 95 on Skill-a-thon will receive (2) two Funcards. This is

AT FINAL WEIGH-IN:

- The market animal may be re-weighed only once.
- The animal will be led off the scales.
- The scales will be balanced and the animal led immediately back on the scales without leaving the site of the scale-man.
- No animal food or water allowed in scale area.

DRESS CODE:

- FOR THE SHOW:
 - All exhibitors must wear a white, sleeved, collared dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with dark blue or black western trousers or western jeans.
 - Boots or leather closed toed shoes.
 - Exhibitors may wear a 4-H or FFA jacket. A 4-H or FFA tie may be worn if the exhibitor desires.
 - No other jackets, vests, or ties will be allowed.
 - <u>All exhibitor are required to wear show numbers on front and back of shirts.</u>
 - FOR SHOWMANSHIP/SALE:

- All exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved shirt, collard dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with nice clean jeans or western dress trousers.
- o Boots or leather closed toes shoes.
- Hats, jackets, ties, vests, will be allowed.
- THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE.

JUDGING:

- Grand and Reserve Grand Champions will be selected. Judging of top five (5) animals will be selected in steer and hog shows only. Second place animal in the class that produces the Grand Champion will be eligible for Reserve Champion.
- Exhibitors will receive ribbons; however, since the exhibitor will profit from the sale of their animal, no premium monies will be awarded. Points will be awarded to those competing for the Scholarships.
- ALL JUDGE'S DECISIONS WILL BE FINAL.

SALE:

- All animals must be considered for sale and considered terminal projects.
- The order of sale will be Grand & Reserve Grand Champions. Top five (5) selected in steer and hog shows only, followed by all first, second, third, etc. places in each class. Buy back prices will be pre-established by the packer's bid.
 - o No riding animals
 - No animal will be sold more than once during the sale.
 - Buy backs will only go to the pre-approved packer.
 - Each exhibitor shall be responsible for his/her own buyer.
 - All exhibitors are encouraged to try and invite new businesses; there is no limit to the number of letters you may send out.
 - \circ $\;$ The more buyers who attend, the better the auction.

BUYER/SALE:

- Five (5) percent of sale value will be deducted by KVLS for expenses of the sale.
- You will also be assessed the current rate for your respective Beef and Hog Councils (if applicable).
- Buyer Gifts will no longer be accepted the night of the auction.
- You will be required to deliver your Buyer Gift when you deliver the Buyer plaque and photo.

POST FAIR:

- Your buyer thank-you letters (one per market entry) must be received in the Fair Office by 5 pm the first Friday after the Fair closes.
 - It must be in an UNSEALED ENVELOPE, STAMPED, ADDRESSED TO YOUR BUYER(S), AND RETURN ADDRESSED. Failure to turn in your letters(s) in the allotted time will result in a fine deduction of the gross amount, per market animal, from your check and the check will be held until you do so.
 - Any exhibitor that fails to submit their thank you letter(s) by the deadline for two (2) consecutive years will not be able to show the next year.
- In addition, each exhibitor is required to hand deliver (or mail deliver, if the buyer is from out of county) buyer photo (photo supplied by KVLS) and/or plaque to their buyer, and Buyer Gift. The KVLS Office will notify exhibitors when the photos are available for delivery, the exhibitor will hand deliver to the buyer, get the buyers signature and return the form to the KVLS Office to receive their check (mail delivery will require a receipt from the post office).
- Exhibitors will be required to accomplish this once the packets are available within 10 business days; any buyer plaque/picture delivery receipt turned in after the 10 business days will result in a 10% deduction of the gross amount, per market animal.

The Board of Directors of the KVLS & Fair will have the final judgment in regard to the interpretation of ALL rules and regulations.

By completing the application form online, exhibitors and parents certify that they have READ and UNDERSTAND the Rules and Regulations set forth in this, and all corresponding documents.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- 1. If you choose to show a second market animal at KVLS, you must abide by the rules & regulations of that animal. The KVLS Board of Directors shall have the right to interpret all rules.
- 2. It must be at least your second year in a row showing a market animal at KVLS to be eligible.
- 3. Market Lamb and Market Goat exhibitors are allowed to show a secondary animal their first year; provided it is a Market Lamb or Market Goat; no Market Steers or Market Hogs will be accepted.
- 4. Once the exhibitor has a second market spot, the exhibitor will retain that spot.
- 5. # of cap on all animals:
 - a. Hogs: 130 | Steers: 150 | Lambs: 35 | Goats: 35
- 6. You cannot show two of the same species. Secondary animal must be different than your primary animal.
- 7. It will be mandatory to complete a record book and take the skill-a-thon on your second animal and abide by all rules from that market animal. If the second record book is not turned to 4-H/FFA you will not be allowed to show a secondary animal the following year. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 8. If the cap is met on the animal of your choice, a drawing will be held on first Thursday after registration closes. You are allowed to be there or you will be contacted to let you know if your application was drawn.
- 9. You will be responsible for your own buyer to come out and bid on your animal, just as you are with your primary animal.

The Osceola County Fair offers its Premier Exhibitor Program to 4-H and FFA exhibitors in the Market Animal Programs, Heifer Program, and/ or Fruit Crop Program. The objective of the Premier Exhibitor Program is to highlight those exhibitors who best exemplify all aspects of Market Animal Program, Heifer Program, and/or Fruit Crop Program.

The Premier Exhibitor is a points system based on exhibitor participation beyond the required minimum. Points will be based on scoring and are given for the following:

Record Book Scores and Placing's
Show and Showmanship Placing's
Personally Delivered Buyer Letters
Market Animal Tabletop
Demonstrations
Attending / Hosting workshops

Skill-a-thon and Skill-a-thon Placing's Fitting & Grooming Placing's Exhibiting & Attending Prospect Shows Intermediate Weigh-In Herdsmanship Resume (Seniors Only)

At the end of the year, based on the number of points you have earned you could win the Premier Exhibitor Award for your primary market animal project. 1st place will receive a belt buckle and monetary award. 2nd and 3rd place will receive a monetary award.

KVLS does not require your participation in the Premier Exhibitor Program. Verification forms must be completed correctly to receive your points.

You must accumulate a minimum of 250 points to be considered for the award. In the event of a Tie the following will be used to determine the Tie Breaker:

1) Score on Skill-A-Thon

3) Showmanship Placing

2) Score on Record Book

4) Tabletop Placing

If you are exhibiting in more than one market project area you can only compete in PEP with your primary animal.

You are required to register for the Premier Exhibitor Award online by Friday, December 18^{th,} 2020. When you register, you are registering to compete in the youth primary market animal. This means that you are competing against all exhibitors in that category. An exhibitor may register to compete in a maximum of three (3) Premier Exhibitor Programs. (Primary Market Animal, Heifer, and/ or Fruit Crop). Market Animal Premier Exhibitor packets and verification forms are required to be turned in at the mandatory meeting in February to be considered for the award. Packets will not be accepted after the mandatory meetings. (Please check the Fruit Crop and Heifer Premier Exhibitor Packets for submission details.)
