NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS
IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested (by the approved laboratory to which it is sent) is the one taken from the animal in question. Its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

SIGNATURES REQUIRED ON THE BACK OF THIS FORM!

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of

their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the AFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

OSCEOLA COUNTY FAIR & LIVESTOCK SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITION

1. The Osceola County Fair & Livestock Show does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or misdirected forms, entries or articles of exhibit.
2. All rules are subject to the interpretation of the Board of Directors of the Fair. All decisions made by the Board are final. This Board reserves the right to deny or allow any entry to the Fair and Fairgrounds.
3. All non-commercial exhibits must check in according to committee guidelines as published. No exhibit may leave the grounds prior to the scheduled release dates & times as indicated in the various calendars and/or individual department or section rules.
4. In all events and exhibits being judged, the judge's decision shall be final.
5. All entries, if not claimed by close of check out time shall become the property of the Fair. All premiums will be paid and checks mailed within 6 weeks after the fair ends. Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of the issue date.
6. A \$30.00 fee or 5% of the face amount will be charged for any bad check received by the Fair for entries, animal sales, sponsorships, contracts, etc.
7. Any formal complaints shall be presented in writing within six (6) hours of the discrepancy to the Fair Office to be handled as they see fit.
8. Any exhibitor or vendor conducting or participating in any illegal or immoral activities on the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to display at the Fair and will lose any monies owed or paid by/to the Fair for premiums, sales, privilege agreements, etc.
9. If these rules contradict any committee rule(s) the committee rule(s) shall prevail.
10. By signing any privilege agreement, license, entry form, etc., participant agrees to release and discharge the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc. and the Board of Directors & staff thereof from all liabilities, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature that may arise from or be connected with the participant's participation in any activity sponsored by Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc.

Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class.

1. Cow/Calf Class – cows three (3) years of age and younger, cows must be born on January 1, 2018 through August 31, 2018. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.

- 1. Animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF).**
- 2. All cattle shown including calves at the side of the dam must be:**
 - A. 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates OR**
 - B. Purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates must be 60% or greater.**

Percentage, fullblood, purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.

JUNIOR SHOW KVLS will follow rule 2 above. No Group Classes
--

- 3. If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.**
- 4. Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not be allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.**
- 5. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows NALF reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:**
 - a) Any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or other substances; animals may be subject to a white-towel test;**
 - b) The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed);**
 - c) The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation;**
 - d) Any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. That includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method.**

PUREBRED CATTLE SHOW

EXCEPTION: In the case of severely sick or dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. That exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

6. Bulls older than one (1) year must show with a nose lead. The Limousin show superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.

7. Protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations must be submitted in writing, signed by five (5) active members of the NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours of the show's completion.

8. NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.

9. NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.

10. Class size shall be to the discretion of the show superintendent and may not contain more than 20 head. The given classes may be split or combined only within their given division.

11. Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow-calf division are eligible to show as individuals.

12. Animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birth marks.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

The following performance-data-submission requirements must be met by Dec. 1 to receive Medal of Excellence points.

a. Birth weight (bulls and heifers) b. Weaning weight (bulls and heifers) c. Yearling weight (bulls and heifers) d. Yearling scrotal circumference e. Pregnancy test (females older than 600 days at season's end) f. Breeding Soundness Exam and semen test (bulls older than 400 days)

NOTE: Failure to have performance data on file at NALF will result in disqualification from the MOE program and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit that information without special requests from NALF.

Credibility Requirement: To maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors are expected to adhere to all NALF rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of Limousin cattle and to adhere to rules and regulations of particular shows, fairs and exhibitions.

AMZA Official Show Rules and Regulations

The following rules and regulations are for American Miniature Zebu Association sanctioned shows and these rules shall govern.

All Registered Miniature Zebras are welcome to show in an AMZA sanctioned show. (Registry must be recognized by the AMZA. Please contact the AMZA with any questions regarding this).

All exhibitors must be a member in good standing with their respectable registry.

Unless otherwise stated within the show documentation, the American Miniature Zebu Association will allow animals to be registered as late as 2 weeks prior to the show.

The original or photocopy of the original registration certificate will need to be made available to the Show Superintendent for every animal entered and the document must be available for inspection during check-in.

All cattle entering the show ring must be 42" or less measured at the hip.

Horned or de-horned animals are acceptable.

All miniature zebu must be shown in their natural state. The only clipping allowed for cattle shown is inner ear, genitalia, and whiskers. No body clipping is allowed. No paint, dye, chalk, or glitter may be used to modify appearance. Only clear polish may be used on hoofs and horns. Tail switch cannot be embellished in any way, no additions to the switch may be added. The alteration of physical features and appearance of any animal by cosmetic and/or surgical means are deemed unethical practices and will be grounds for disqualifications.

All animals must show with a halter and lead strap attached to the halter. It shall be at the exhibitor's discretion whether to use a nose ring. Any animal that becomes unruly or dangerous may be disqualified by the judge.

Any animal disqualified from its class will not be counted in the total number of animals shown for sanction purposes.

Entries in the group classes must also show in their respective age class.

Permanent Grand Champion animals may be entered in their respective age group OR the Champion Challenge but NOT both.

It is recommended that every show animal has some sort of permanent identification. It is not necessary now, but eventually all miniature zebu cattle shown will need to be identified. This could be tattoos, USDA tags, or brands. Please check with your State requirements on cattle identification. This permanent identification needs to match the animal's AMZA registration papers.

Health certificates may be required if specified in the show rules of the show venue. When health certificates are not required by the show venue, the Show Officials shall see that all animals brought to the show are in apparent good health and free from noticeable disease. Show officials may deny entry if an animal does not appear to be in good health.

The AMZA has the best interest of the exhibitor and animal at hand, therefore the AMZA does not allow classes to be combined for any reason.

There must be a minimum of 4 heifers shown in a show and a minimum of 3 exhibitors for the wins to be considered as "Official Legs" towards a PGCH.

There must be a minimum of 4 cows shown in a show and a minimum of 3 exhibitors for the wins to be considered as "Official Legs" towards a PGCH.

There must be a minimum of 4 Jr. bulls shown in a show and a minimum of 3 exhibitors for the wins to be considered as "Official Legs" towards a PGCH.

There must be a minimum of 4 Sr. bulls shown in a show and a minimum of 3 exhibitors for the wins to be considered as "Official Legs" towards a PGCH.

There must be a minimum of 4 steers shown in a show and a minimum of 3 exhibitors for the wins to be considered as "Official Legs" towards a PGCH. There are no age restrictions on accumulation of points towards PGCH.

A show program will need to be provided 10 days prior to the show/event for the AMZA to verify all AMZA exhibitors and animals that have been entered into the show.

A signed copy of each show program with the official show results is to be mailed to the AMZA office at, PO Box 2095, Lady Lake, FL 32158, no later than 10 days following the show. The Show Secretary must also retain a signed copy of each show program with the official show results for 12 months following the AMZA sanctioned show. Show results must be legible with a date, signature, and printed name.

All AMZA sanctioned shows must be advertised as such by the Venue/Organization that has been approved to hold an AMZA sanctioned show. Advertisements may be as such, all printed materials of such shows, advertisements of such shows on social media, or otherwise.

There will be no Sanction Fees unless the venue/organization is asking for extras such as, but not limited to, rosettes or awards to be provided by the AMZA.
